The report of an attack by the Wangoni in the district of Lindi has not been confirmed. Captain Seyfried has marched thence north of Masset to the Ilulu Plateen.

Captain Baron von Wangepheim has dispersed a band of insurgents about 600 strong; after a hard fight near Isega north of the Meanga hille, and is now marching on Vidunda. He considers that the rebellion in the district of Morogoro is practically crushed as a result.

October 17th.

In the district of Morogoro, according to an announcement of the "Bezirksemt", no signs of unrest are at present discernible. The caravan roadsto Kilossa and the Coast are declared to be open. The inhabitants willingly supply porters and provisions to the Caravans.
