My Lord:-

In continuation of my despatch No. 151 of the 21st ultimo relative to the rising in German East Africa, I have the honour to transmit to Your Lordship herewith a translation of official reports on the subject which were published in the "Deutsch-Ostafrikanische Zeitung" of the 18th November.

The subsequent issues of this newspaper contain little of interest, the official news being confined to the movements of the various columns which are perambulating the country, and to a series of small skirmishes in the Uhahe, Mahenge and Songea districts in which the total German losses have amounted to four soldiers killed and nine wounded, and, of the auxiliary native troops, sixty killed and forty-five wounded or missing.

November 13th.

According to a report from Mohoro, the insurgents from the Matumbi and Kitchi Mountains have taken advantages of the absence of Naval Lieutenant Paasche in the direction of the Pangani rapids of the Rufiyi, to make an incursion between Nyamwiki and Mtanza in the Rufiyi district. They have burnt down numerous huts and carried off women and children.

According to later news received, about one thousand insurgents attacked and burnt down the village of Kondoa and a number of hamlets near Kilossa. The population fled to the Boma. The insurgents, who soon turned South were followed by Bezirksamtman Lambrecht and cornet Colberg and suffered losses in consequence. For the protection

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of the caravan road and Ilonga Mission, a fortified camp has been established under the command of Corporal Ernst.

According to a report from the District Officer at New Langenburg, the united divisions of Captains Richter and Nigmann and 1st Lieutenant Klinghardt have engaged four thousand Wangoni at Njamabengo north East of Georgea, and inflicted heavy losses on them. The Wangoni have besides suffered numerous losses in several patrol skirmishes.

1st Lieutenant von Krieg has passed through the mountainous country between the Lukossa and the right bank of the Ruhaha with his detachment of the Iringa Company and numerous auxiliaries, and dispersed bands of insurgents which were marching against Kilossa. The insurgents suffered heavy losses. He then continued his march towards Utchungwa where the loyal native population were threatened by the insurgents. Captain von Bismarck operated on the Ulanga with a part of the Mahenge Company and numerous auxiliaries sent by Sultan Kiwanga. The

Sultan himself fell in the fight at Mko.

From Bismarckberg, as a result of the withdrawal of the garrison to Ssongea, various acts of insubordination on the part of certain Jumbes are reported.

The town and district of Tabora is quite peaceful. Trade to Mwanza and Ujiji is undisturbed.

November 17th.

The fortified camp at Kibatta in the Matumbi Mountains was attacked early on November 14th by a band of insurgents, estimated at a strength of one thousand men. The assailants were driven back and left many dead and a number of weapons. No European or askari was injured. Captain Nigmann has marched back to his district Iringa after his victorious fight at Ssongea. 1st Lieutenant von Krieg has marched from Iringa to Mahenge, in order to bring ammunition, clothes and rations to Captain von Hassel's detachment.

Major Johannes has received orders to detach a company from Liwale for service at Mahenge.

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Captain Seyfried reports from Jiridi that he has subdued Likende and Kitais and sent several hundred prisoners to Jiridi.

A detachment of marines from Kiliwa, under lieutenant von Stengel has taken two large insurgent camps, North of the Jumbo Kaprina's place.

Councillor Boeder has returned from the southern portion of Daressalam district. The population has submitted after several fights.
