I am to add that quotations for chartering a boat show that the present cost of transport over the Uganda Railway is Mombass to Maivasha exceeds 50% of the cost of freight and fodder for the whole distance from Melbourne to Mombasa. The railway rates for the transport of sheep in other British Possessions place in an unfavourable light the Uganda Railwa tariff. My Directors are informed that the following rates obtain elsewhere:
