My Lord,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of
Your Lordship's despatch No. 869 of the 16th ultimo,
regarding the leasing of large areas, and to state that
the instructions therein contained will be carefully
observed.

2. I find that there are at present applications in the
Land Office from eleven applicants for large concessions
in connection with which negotiations varying in extent
have been conducted by the Land Officer. I propose to
