With reference to my telegram No. 3 of 17th  
 instant reporting that Captain Salkeld is willing to  
 resign his commission in the army if appointed a  
 Collector in the East Africa Protectorate, I have the  
 honour to state that in the event of the Treasury sanction  
 being accorded to Your Lordship's proposal, Captain  
 Salkeld begs that the following requests may be forwarded  
 to the Army Council:

I That his name may be put on the Reserve of  
Officers.

II That he may be permitted to wear his uniform  
on suitable occasions and retain his title.
