SPECIAL NATIVE COURTS.

It is hereby enacted as follows:-

- (1) This Ordinance may be cited as "The Native (Special) Courts' Amendment Ordinance 1904.
- (2) The High Court shall have in relation to any proceeding, sentence or order before imposed or made by a Special Court all the powers conferred upon a High Court by the Criminal Procedure Code 1898, (Indian Act No. V of 1898), as applied to the East Africa Protectorate.
- (3) Section 15 of East Africa Native Courts' Amendment Ordinance 1902 is hereby repealed.
