Transcript of Telegram from Sir D. Stewart to Mr. Lyttelton 35

(Received at Colonial Office, 1.26 p.m., 13th April, 1905.)

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Re 109. Have received following from the Sub-Commissioner of Kismayo. Yusuf Ugas son of Ugas Garch, Chief of Ker Afgab Auliham and Hassan Abdi, his nephew arrived at Kismayo on April 2nd. Ugas Garch has sent them to ask for help against the Mad Mullah who wrote two months ago to Ugas Garch commanding 1000 rifles, 1000 mules, 1000 camels and 1000 fighting men, failing which he threatens to destroy ~~the~~ Afghans who are most anxious to be allowed to cross the Juba to Obock, Kil Wax, Ind., Bardera district. They state that a similar letter has been sent to Marushan living between ~~the~~ and Bardera on the British bank of the Juba. They are afraid of being driven within the next two months, as they have ~~left~~ ²⁶ to ~~the~~ ^{the} camp of Marabul Ogaden when Mullah ~~had~~ ^{had} already ~~had~~ ^{had} a ~~camp~~ ^{camp} about December. They state that Ker Afgab and his son are strong and have over 1000 rifles. They say that a similar letter was written from somewhere near the sea-coast on 2nd February and was very active lately. This tends to confirm the statement of the ~~former~~ refugee who left ^{On 2nd} Obock on 28th February to the effect that the ~~enemies~~ have cleared the ~~region~~ ^{Obock} and taken a strong force of ~~refugees~~ ^{under Ali} Yusuf and ~~1000~~ ¹⁰⁰⁰ near Bulkuun (between Obock and Jiddukuu) about 15th taking 20 miles from ~~refugees~~. Further fighting was in progress when the refugee left. Ugas Garch with the bulk of Ker Afgab is at Bargeile, latitude $4^{\circ}30'$ longitude $47^{\circ}40'$ E. I suggest that advantage be taken of present high river to send an officer to Bardera with Yusuf Ugas and Abdurrahman Mursal to ascertain facts and report on... in view of this unexpected serious information. Success of Turvian raid on Ker Afgab will react unfavourably on our interests in Jubaland and will give the Mullah ~~more~~ ^{more} ~~time~~ ^{time} to ~~attack~~ ^{attack} our Ogadens. Please refer to my documents No. 59 & word unintelligible.
