contained in the telegram, and
unable to advise us in any way
without any information as to the
circumstances. He suggested that
we should ask for a full report by
mail.

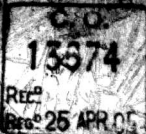

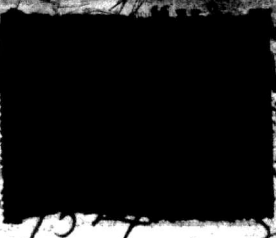
