Sir,

With reference to your despatch No. 256 of 9th ultimo, I have the honour to report that I have issued to Messrs. MacDougall and Howlis two of the medals and clasps from the stock in hand.

2. This stock of medals and clasps- numbering at the present time one hundred and thirty three- has been obtained owing to men entitled to them having died or been discharged before they were issued. As some of the latter are constantly sending in claims for them, and as it is laid down in paragraph 2045c of the King's Regulations that unclaimed medals should be sent back after 10 years, I have the honour to request that I may be permitted to keep them for the present and not return them as required in War Office despatch
