honour to report that the contract for this work was  
given to Messrs. Gailey and Roberts, a local Firm of  
Contractors, in June 1905.

2. In accordance with a clause inserted in  
the contract that it could be terminated by a month's  
notice on either side, Messrs. Gailey and Roberts have

now given notice of their intention of abandoning the work owing to the impossibility of obtaining sufficient native labour, a difficulty which would be experienced equally by any other contractors.

3. It is true that labour is plentiful in the Kikuyu and Kenya Districts, but experience has shown that natives from these parts are practically useless when employed on or near the coast. In addition to the fact that they are continually falling sick, they will not remain at work for any length of time.

4. Under the circumstances there appeared to be no alternative but to adopt a suggestion put forward by the Acting Manager, to import five hundred coolies from India and to do the work departmentally. This proposal was, I understand, approved by Mr.Currie. The only difficulty we should have to contend with would be lack of supervision but I trust that the temporary Engineer asked for in my despatch No.234 of May 8th may be available by that time.

5. I have been the more inclined to adopt this course to which indeed there would be no alternative but the abandonment of the work already commenced - as I am

informed that this labour can be utilized later on in connection with the new pier or wharves at Kilindini, and I trust that under the circumstances my action will meet with Your Lordship's approval.
