Sir,

I am directed by Mr. Secretary Thomas to call attention to the recent Companies Ordinance of Uganda (No. 82 of 1955) and to point out that there are now some minor divergences between the companies' legislation in force in the three territories of Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika.

2. In legislative measures dealing with such things as commercial companies the greatest possible uniformity is desirable, and it is suggested that the question should be brought before the next Law Officers' Conference with the aim of smanding the Ordinances se as to provide not generally similar but absolutely identical legislation in the three territories. It may be that such an aim is impossible of attainment owing to local divergences, but the Secretary of State is of the opinion that the question should be examined and the differences, which are not of great importance, recognised, if possible.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Companies short to-(Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, and shall be read as one with the Companies Ordinance, 1933, heremafter referred to as the No. 25 Principal Ordinance.

Provided that if special circumstances exist, which render it, in the opinion of the registrar, expedient that such an exemption should be granted, the registrar may grant, subject to such conditions as he may specify, exemption from the obligations imposed by this subsection.

LEGAL REPORT

THE COMPANIES (ASSENDED T) (11), 1933.

Under section 324 of the Prigci al Ordinance every company, including a private company, is required to submit admits to the Registrar a balance sheet. The law is the same in the United Kingdom, but in actual practice the authorities there do not require private companies isobrporated outside Great Britain to comply with the previsions of the law. As it is not intended that private companies incorporated outside the Colony should annually submit a balance sheet to the Registrar it is considered desirable to amend the local law, and this Bill effects the necessary amendment.

I have the honour to refer to paragraph 2 of your despatch, Confidential (2), of the 29th November regarding Ordinance No. XXVIII of 1933 entitled "An Ordinance to Regulate Trading Companies and other Associations".

I have caused the question of the inadequacy of the comparative table enclosed in Mr. Moore's Confidential despatch No.132 of the 20th September, and of the absence of spare copies of the legislation upon which the Ordinance is based, marked in red ink to show deviations from the original, to be referred to the Attorney General.
