My Lord;

In obedience to the instructions contained in the Marquess of Lansdowne's despatch No. 132 of March 4th 1904 addressed to Sir C. Eliot, I have the honour to submit herewith the draft of an Ordinance relating to the registration of sea going dhows. I also enclose a copy of a letter from the Crown Advocate on the subject and a tabulary statement.

2. The necessity for this ordinance is apparent from the correspondence which took place between the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and the Commissioner for East Africa in 1903. Since then the dual appointment of Commissioner for East Africa and Agent and Consul General

for Zanzibar has been abolished, and as under the existing regulations (No. 2 of 1894) a licence to native vessels to fly a British flag can only be issued by the latter, there is no officer in the East Africa Protectorate who can license ships owned by natives of the Protectorate to fly either the British or the Protectorate flag.


