In obedience to the instructions contained in paragraph 10 of Your Lordship's despatch No. 173 of March 30th, I have the honour to submit herewith a joint report by the Protectorate Treasurer and the Acting Manager of the Uganda Railway on the advisability of continuing payments by the Railway to the Protectorate for the policing of the line.

I agree with the views expressed by Messrs. Bowring and Sandiford. As long as the Protectorate police are employed solely on "Watch and Ward" their pay should be a charge on the Railway Vote, but all

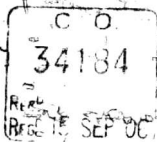

We are of the opinion that so long as the Protective Police are employed solely on "Watch and Ward", as apart from "law and order", their pay should be a charge on the Railway vote but that all police employed at Railway stations or elsewhere on the line on "law and order" should be financed by the Police Department.
