My Lord,

I have had under consideration the question as to whether the Junior Officers of the Protectorate Civil Service should not be required to undergo some examination in Law.

2. After consultation with the Judges of the High Court and the Crown Advocate we are agreed that it would be a great advantage if some such examination were enforced, and it is proposed that this should be in the Penal Code, in procedure both Civil and Criminal and in the elementary rules of evidence.

3. I would suggest that the passing of this examination be made compulsory in the case of newly appointed Assistant Collectors, who would be required to satisfy the examiners

during their year of probation, and in the case of all existing Assistant Collectors, who should be required to pass as soon as possible, any provisions in the meanwhile being made on the understanding that the examination will be passed within a year.

4. It is suggested that the examination should be of an academic nature, and that it is necessary to ensure that the Candidate has given sufficient time and study to the subject to enable him to deal properly with the paper that will be put before him, and not merely exercise of his office.

5. The subject of the examination, which should be held, say, twice a year, should be that of the subject.

I would ask Your Lordship's approval of this proposal, which cannot but conduce to increased efficiency.
