Your Lordship's despatch No. 156 of March 23rd, I have the honour to report that the number of houses for which furniture would be required is 149 single houses and 32 double houses. This is inclusive of the Railway bungalows which number 26 single and 2 double quarters.

3. Owing to the furniture vote being inadequate, however, but few houses have been supplied with a full set of furniture.


