In the exercise of the powers vested in me by His Majesty for power to grant the said commissions, I am instructed to inform you that His Majesty's pleasure is that your conferring on them the right to purchase the said charters for offences committed by them. Sir,

I am directed by His Majesty's Commissioner to inform you, in reply to your letter No. 3 of May 3rd, that the necessary steps have been taken to ensure the Officers of the Survey being granted disciplinary powers over the natives working under them.

2. A letter must be addressed by the officer, on whom you wish to have the powers conferred, to the Sub-Commissioner of the Province in which he is travelling asking for permission to punish the porters of his caravan for offences committed by them.

It will not be necessary to apply for a fresh authority each time the officer travels in the Province.

A record of the punishments inflicted must be kept and a return made.
