This is because Major C. has got hold

will bring him on W.O. pay from
the 22nd July.

As far as I recollect (the papers
with Major Bright) Capt B. was granted
leave for 3 mos for 1/10. The 1/10 was
brought back for 4 days leave vote &
we are awaiting F.O. reply to this
suggestion.

The D. C. vote will thus save the amount
of Capt B. pay from 22nd to end of Sept. 1892

Sir,

I am commanded by the Army Council to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th instant, No. 20552/1906 and to inform you that it has been noted that Lieutenant T. T. Behrens will be available for restoration to his Corps on the 1st of October.

2. In view of the circumstances stated in your letter the Council have approved, as a special case, of the service of Captain & Brevet Major R. G. T. Bright, C.M.G., Rifle Brigade, remaining at the disposal of your Department, to enable him to proceed to Berlin, in connection with the negotiations for the final settlement of the boundary between German East Africa and Uganda, and the British East Africa Protectorate.

3. I am, however, to point out that, as this Officer has been extra-Regimentally employed since the 18th of June 1897, he must, under the provisions of the Royal Warrant, Art. 83, be available for duty with his Regiment not later than the 18th of June 1907, unless he retires from the Army before that date.
