Sir,

With reference to your memorandum of the 26th July last, No. 27027, forwarding a copy of a despatch from the Commissioner, East Africa Protectorate, regarding the loss of certain medals belonging to Police Constable Ibrahim bin Kalambo, British East Africa Protectorate Police, I am commanded by the Army Council to acquaint you, for the information of the Earl of Elgin, that the medal rolls of the East Africa Rifles show that No. 650, Ibrahim Karambo was awarded the Africa General Service Medal with clasp inscribed "Jubaland", but his name is not traced on any "Mwele" or East and Central Africa Medal rolls.

The Admiralty report that Private Brahimu Karambo of the East Africa Protectorate Force was awarded a medal for the operations at M'wele in 1895-96, and I am therefore to request that you will be so good as to ascertain whether this man is identical with Police Constable Ibrahim bin Kalambo.

I am to add that as there is no record of a medal
