With reference to Mr. Lucas' letter of the 14th instant, relative to the examination in the Swahili language of Mr. R. W. B. Eustace, Assistant District Superintendent of Police in the service of the East Africa Protectorate;

I am directed by the Civil Service Commissioners to enquire whether it is the wish of the Earl of Elgin that the nature and extent of Mr. Eustace's examination should be in accordance with that described in the Memorandum which accompanied Mr. Antrobus' letter (6856/1906) of the 8th of March, 1906, relative to the case of Captain C. H. Stigand.

The Commissioners make this enquiry because it is not clear to them whether that Memorandum applies to gentlemen serving in the East Africa Protectorate as well as to gentlemen serving in the British Central Africa Protectorate.

I am to add that the Commissioners would probably be able to make arrangements for the examination of Mr. Eustace to take place in London before the 15th of October next; but, in the meantime, they would be glad to be furnished with his address and would be obliged if he could be instructed to fill up and return to this Office the Form herewith enclosed.
