Re Transfer of Araboko Forest to Mr. Pauling.

Application has been made for payment of the rent

for the second half year on the Araboko Forest.

The question of the Transfer to Mr. Pauling has not
yet been settled, though I was advised some considerable time
ago that the Commissioner's Report upon the question was on
its way to the Colonial Office.

Though perfectly ready, and willing to pay the
amount due for rent, the uncertainty of the present position
does not justify such a course, and I would urge that the
anomalous position in which Mr. Pauling is placed with regard
to the matter, should be a potent reason for a speedy decision
being arrived at by H. M. Government, and I have the honour
to ask that this matter may now have immediate attention.
