I am directed by the Secretary of State for the Honours to inform you that, in accordance with a special regulation, Officers and Servants of the various Indian States on the various Hill and High Altitude Colonies and Territories are also required to attend a course of instruction and training of the type of the Royal Indian Constabulary in India. The first appointments in this respect are hereby invited to the country.

The duration of the course and the number of entries is as stated in the instruction and to give the necessary details upon the regulations and provisions of each selection form. All are invited, subject to the usual conditions.

If you are not attached to the Service you will be required to attend the course at your own expense. The necessary and sufficient details of the course and conditions are attached to the form and should be read carefully.

The official fees for application are defrayed by Government, and you will be entitled, except in the contingency hereafter stated, to remuneration and allowances during the course at the prevailing rates.

The duties of the candidates are defined in the regulations and at the same time for the period of such contracts of your service of which as may become necessary to enable you to complete the course.

(2) *Existing allowance at the rate of 20 per diem under*



(3) *Existing allowance of 1 per diem.*

(4) *Travel, also railway and steamer passage between place of residence, and while going and returning, on production of receipts in support of the expenses made.*

*These receipts should be forwarded direct to the Comptroller for the Chairman, who may be instructed to pay the amount due to him, together with the allowance above mentioned.*

*No claim for reimbursement for travelling expenses other than those specified, shall be entertained.*

6. *The Secretary of State, Secretary of the Board, or any other officer of the Board, is authorized to refund any portion of the above-mentioned travelling expenses, and to give in receipt therefor with the receipt of the forwarding paragraph, in the event of their finding it difficult to obtain necessary receipts at the termination of the mission.*
