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MEMORANDUM.

I regret the error I made in my previous letter in which I stated that 2 cusecs = 32,000 gallons per hour; it was a slip in writing which I omitted to detect.

The whole scheme had been somewhat modified which accounts for the other discrepancies mentioned by the Consulting Engineers.

In the light of their latest remarks I have again altered the arrangement so that we can be sure of getting the necessary power.

The figures to be worked to now are:-

Total virtual head to be overcome = 170 ft.

Total water to be delivered - 1250 gallons per hour.

Total clear head available between bottom of supply tank and tail water after allowing for floods - 10 feet.

Total minimum water available - 44,900 gallons per hour.

When sending out the plant I shall be much obliged if the Consulting Engineers will send the necessary plans showing the way in which it should be erected.
