When Mr. Jackson received this note he was not
aware that I had seen Colonel Patterson in England and
supported his application. Mr. Jackson knows
Colonel Patterson better than I do and therefore his
opinion is entitled to weight. At the same time I do
not see that sufficient grounds have been advanced to
induce us to qualify the opinion I expressed that

I have ascertained from the Manager of the
 Police that he is reported to have been very energetic
 whilst employed on the Railway, and well thought of by
 Sir George Whitehouse, and I understand that he did good

A. There is certainly one point for consideration
 and that is whether Colonel Patterson has any medical
 or veterinary knowledge, or is sufficient of a
 naturalist, qualifications which, it was suggested in
 my despatch of the 16th September last, would
 be desirable. But I question whether we should be able
 to obtain the services of a suitable officer from the
 Army Medical Department on the salary offered, more
 especially as the salary has not been reduced to £,500/-
 I had not lost sight of this point when the Manager
 came before me in England, and I enquired whether
 whether Colonel Patterson would accept the loss of the
 reduced salary.

5. I cannot agree with Mr. Jackson would be a suitable selection. For one thing he is lacking in tact, a qualification most necessary in the head of the Game Department.

6. As regards the two posts of Assistant Game Rangers, I have today telegraphed to the Secretary, urgently urging that Mr. [unclear], D.O. [unclear] should be confirmed in his temporary appointment. His selection has turned out to be a good one and he is reported to have done excellent work.

7. For the second post of Assistant, I have recommended Mr. G. J. Goldfinch, whom, I understand, my predecessor had marked out for such employment, and on whose application Mr. Jackson reported in his despatch No. 44 of the 3rd January last. He is a thorough gentleman, a keen sportsman and continually in the saddle.
