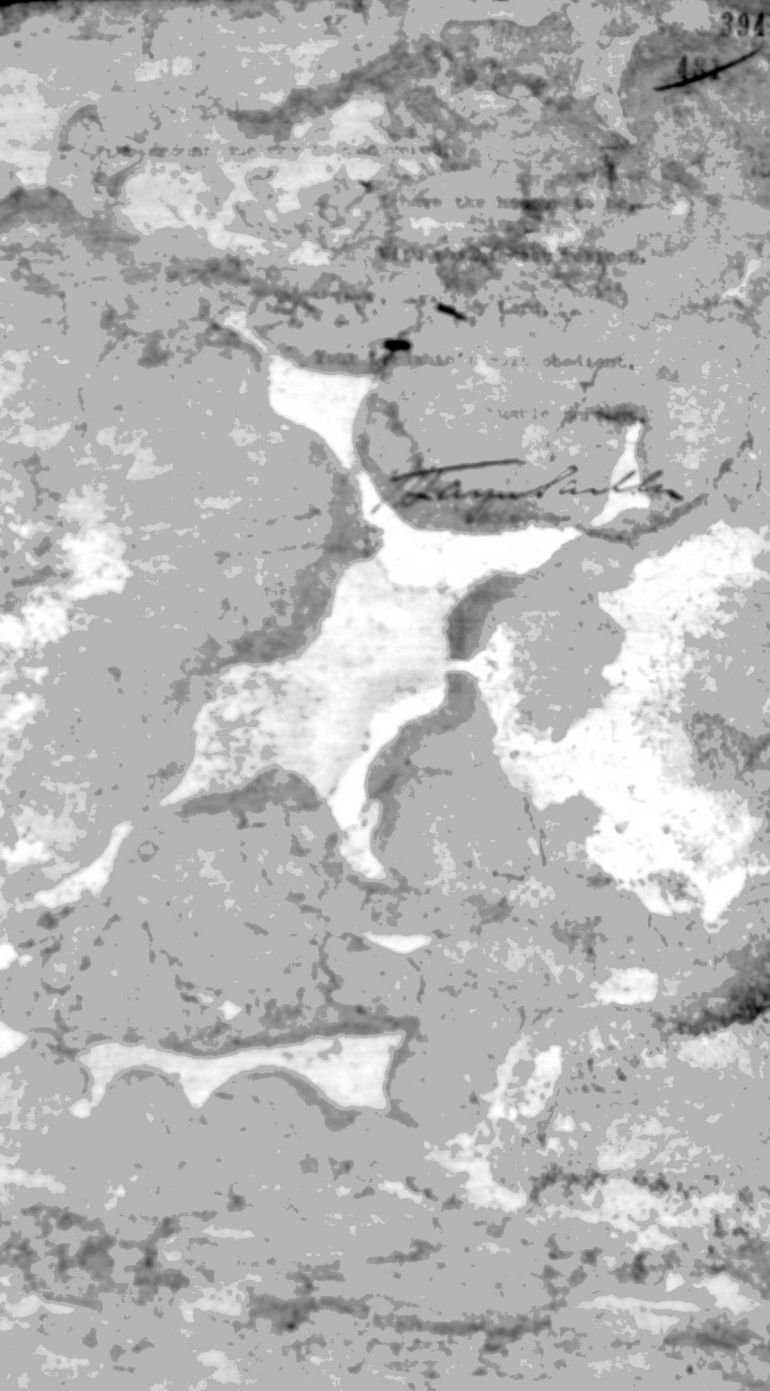

THE AGREEMENT TO the sum due from Messrs. Charlesworth Billing & Co. Limited.

His Excellency,

On receipt of the conditions contained in the J. B. No. 102 of December 18th I instructed Messrs. Messer & Co. to inform Messrs. Charlesworth Billing & Co. that their offer could not be accepted and that unless they were prepared to make a considerably larger offer which could be placed before His Excellency for consideration the proceedings for execution would have to be continued.

It appears that Messrs. Charlesworth Billing & Co. were unable to access their accounts at the end of March last I was informed by Messrs. Messer & Co. that their representatives at Swatara had on the 11th of that month applied to the Court for execution but that the Judge had adjourned the application until June 15th to enable Mr. Charlesworth to consult his brother in England.

I have instructed Messrs. Messer & Co. to renew the application on that date.

I have been informed that Messrs. Charlesworth Billing & Co. had a considerable sum of money due of some £500 last year and I hope that the Government will be able to recover a considerable proportion of the sum due to them.
