My Lords

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 14th inst. with a copy of a letter which I have received from the Secretary of the Indian Railway regarding the invaliding of Mr. Fuller, who was reported to be on duty of my

1001. Mr. Fuller's application

- (1) that Mr. Fuller is entitled to receive his gratuity and
- (2) that the Government shall bear the cost of his passage and pay of his family in his absence.

I have granted Mr. Fuller 4 months' leave, but do not consider that it is necessary to pay him at the normal rate, viz. full pay for 3 months and three quarters of pay

for one month at the rate of Rs. 500/- per annum. On special duty he was drawing whilst employed on the Hindustani work.
