I suppose the siding or small branch is necessary. I calculate the full cost on this part of the Railway as worth £2000 and it is estimated that the siding will be required in 10 years, so that it will be full worth £2000 at end of 10 years. If this is so the full amount of funds by borrowing the money from allocated but unexpended capital may be repaid by the annual charges against the same
