## World's News by Cable.

### Lord Roberts' Book. Compulsory Military Service.

Appeals to Historical Facts.

(Reuter's Special to "E. A. Standard.")  
London.  
John Murray, the publishers, are publishing a book from the pen of Field Marshal Lord Roberts, entitled "Fallacies and Facts." It contains arguments against compulsory service contained in General Sir Jan Hamilton's book and in Mr. Haldane's introduction thereto. It insists that a fortnight's training yearly of the Territorials would not give in fifty years the stability of discipline required in a modern war; the irreducible minimum it states to be four to six months of continuous training as a climax to years of cadet training. The book dwells on the great need of the power of expansion of regular forces able to be fed from a compulsory home army in a time of national struggle. It concludes that if we intend to maintain the balance of power in Europe, while we move steadily in the path of Empire elsewhere, we must be able to render efficient military aid to any first rate power with whom we are in alliance. It was because we had no military power with which to follow up Trafalgar that we were burdened with the expense of ten more years of war. It predicts a similar danger in the future.

### Austria's Escort to Hohenzollern

London.  
Reuter's at Pola, Austria's Chief Naval Station, states that the Austrian fleet of 41 ships including 3 battle ships and commanded by Archduke Franz Ferdinand steamed out on March 28 to meet the Kaiser's yacht "Hohenzollern" en route to Corfu. They fired a salute of 21 guns and manoeuvred their vessels so as to enclose the "Hohenzollern" and accompanied her for part of her voyage. The Kaiser signalled his thanks and congratulated on the brilliant manoeuvre Archduke Franz Ferdinand replied that he was happy to be able personally to lead his squadron past His Majesty.

### Albanian Revolt.

Rebels Seize Munitions of War

London.  
It is reported from Cetinje that four Albanian tribes are in open revolt. They have attacked and destroyed all the brick houses in the district of Tusi on the Montenegrin frontier, setting rifle, ammunition and cannon. Yesterday they occupied the town of Tusi whence the Turkish garrison was withdrawn so concentrate on the neighbouring town of Shipcad where it is expected they will make a strong resistance. It is reported that Cetinje has also revolted.

### Destructive Fire.

New York State Capitol. State Library Gutted.

London, March 30.  
Reuter's correspondent at New York reports that the State Capitol is a fire and threatened with destruction. The fire started in the early morning and illuminated the whole city. The State Library, valued at a million dollars was soon gutted.  
LATER: From Washington it is reported that the fire in the Capitol was extinguished at noon. The damage estimated at \$5,000,000 including the value of some unique documents. Nothing is insured.

Reuter's at Constantinople reports that Colonel Schickelmeier, a German instructor in the Turkish army, was shot dead by an Albanian soldier who during drill resented a reprimand for slackness. The culprit has been arrested. A Turkish soldier was recently similarly assassinated at Salonica by a soldier who had been reprimanded.

Malaria Facts

Such relapses are frequently encountered by fatigue, heat, chill, wasting, dissipation and attacks of other illnesses. They may occur at intervals for a long time after the patient was first infected, and after he has moved to localities where there is no malaria. It is probable that as long as one parasite remains alive in the patient's blood he remains subject to such relapses. Malaria fever, the parasite often produces anaemia and enlargement of the spleen, especially in patients who have suffered from many relapses. Death is sometimes caused by sudden and profuse sweats. Chief among these are the symptoms known as Blackwater Fever, or Haemoglobinuria, which generally occurs in old and neglected infections.

Parasites and the Fever

Parasites are also known by the names Paludism, Marsh Fever, Malaria, Fever, Ague and Periodic Fever. It is often called by local names such as Country Fever, West African Fever, Burma Fever, and so on. The parasites which cause Malaria fever, Remittent Fever, Periodic Fever and Blackwater Fever. Malaria fever occurs more or less in all warm climates, especially in the summer, after rains, and near marshy ground, and causes a fever of one of the total sick weeks in the tropics. It is caused by enormous numbers of the minute parasites in the blood called Plasmodia.

These parasites are introduced into the blood through the proboscis of certain species of the mosquito called Anopheles. On being introduced each parasite enters one of the red corpuscles of the blood, in which it lives and grows.

On reaching maturity each parasite produces a number of spores which escape from the containing corpuscle, and enter fresh corpuscles; and this method of propagation may be continued indefinitely for years. Thus, though only a few hundreds or thousands of the parasites may be originally introduced through the mosquito's proboscis, their number rapidly increases until as many as some millions of them may exist in the blood.

At first, while the number of parasites is still small, the infected person may remain apparently well. When, however, the number is large enough, he begins to suffer from fever. The parasites tend to produce their spores all at the same time; and it is at the moment when these spores escape that the patient's fever begins.

The fever is probably caused by a little mucus which escapes from each parasite with the spores.

After from six to forty hours on these spores is eliminated from the patient's system; and his fever then tends to leave him. In the meantime, however, another generation of parasites may be approaching maturity, and may cause another attack of fever like the first, and so on, indefinitely for weeks or months. In this manner the attacks of fever follow each other at regular intervals.

But it often happens that before one attack has entirely ceased another one commences, and the attacks overlap each other, and the fever is continued.

After a time, even without treatment, the number of parasites may decrease, until not enough of them are left to produce fever. When this happens, the fever ceases. It is generally supposed that the fever ceases when the parasites have been entirely destroyed. But the author supposes of attack.

The man at the bank suggested that the movement, was not, by any means, a non-party one.

Mr. Griffiths thought their friend at the bank might take a lesson from the Social Democrats who had spoken, and look at the matter from the standpoint of the "brotherhood of man" or the "brotherhood of the nation."

The Chairman said the league had only been formed a few weeks, but they were all ready over 200 strong, and they included both Liberals and Socialists in their membership.

Another questioner asked if it was the intention of the league to run candidates, and if so what side of the House of Commons it would stand for.

The reply was given by Mr. Griffiths that the candidates, when there were any, would be standing for a Parliament of the Empire, and not for the British House of Commons.

Mr. Connolly suggested that at the next meeting hold a Liberal member of the League should be asked to preside, so as to squash all belongings and party feeling.

The Chairman: "That has been our aim all the time, to show that we are non-party."

Votes of thanks to the speakers and the chairman followed.

Captain Grogan, in responding, said it was a most exciting project to make the "nation and" and the "league" meet, better acquainted. He drew a harrowing picture of the institutions to be seen on the Thames Embankment, and thought that State aided emigration was feasible and desirable.

The Social Democrats have provided great amusement by enquiring if there was not a Right to Work Act, which had never been repealed.

Captain Grogan was at a loss. His resolution was that the "Right to Work" Bill did not pass the first reading. Various other explanations were attempted; but the Social Democrats were unimpressed. "Oh," he said, "it was a bit better than that." At length, he himself volunteered the desired information: "I believe it was an Act passed in Elizabeth's time and never been repealed." (Loud laughter.)

A number of members of the league were enrolled at the close.

**Big Game in the Congo.**

License to Shoot.

It is officially notified that the formality of diplomatic recommendation is no longer necessary to obtain a license for shooting game in the Congo.

In future, anyone can obtain a license on applying to the proper authorities (who are enumerated in article 13 of an Ordinance dated 12th October, 1910) subject of course to the conditions prescribed by law.

We give a literal translation of the article 13 giving the proper authorities. It reads: "The Governor (General, or, in the parts of the Congo constituted under the Vice Governor General's administration, then the Vice Governor General) may issue special individual permits. All other permits to hunt are issued by the Governor General, the District Commissioner, the Chief of Zone, the Chief of section, according to the administration circumscription where application is made."
