WORLD'S NEWS.

BY CABLE.

Morocco Rebellion.

Shops in Fez Looted. Concentration of French Forces. Relief for Major Bremont.

German Press Campaign.

Heuter's Special to 'E.A. Standard.' A letter from Dr. Weyden, the English physician at Fez, has been received in London. He states that the tribe called in to keep order had looted the shops in town. The Europeans, he writes, had dismissed the position fully and but were unable to form a plan promising success. Paris, April 22. M. Bolezet the French consul general at Algiers left there on April 19 with a troop of instructors carrying money and ammunition for Major Bremont.

News which fell on April 15.

The reinforcements going to Casablanca include 1,500 Senegalese besides French Algerian troops. A transport carrying guns and infantry and artillery left Fez for Casablanca about a great parting demonstration. More of the colonial infantry are embarking at Marseilles.

Paris, April 24. To-day's news points to the decision of the French Government to dispatch a large French expedition to relieve the forces in Fez if the occasion demands it. Meanwhile in support of its impotence a flying column composed entirely of French Algerian troops has already left the Shawia country in the direction of Fez. The Moroccan Mahdi, raised from Shawia tribes, commanded by French officers and stiffened by an admixture of French with artillery, followed the French force of some 10,000 men including 2,000 cavalry will be concentrated at Casablanca ready for emergency. Communications have been issued semi-officially, it is stated in Paris, that if French will evacuate Fez as soon as order and the Sultan's authority are re-established. London, April 24. A letter from an English lady missionary at Fez, dated April 17, received in London, gives no sign of alarm but states that one English woman is suffering from typhoid and it was therefore impossible for the others to leave even if the last road open had not been occupied by the rebels. Berlin, April 25. The German press are vigorously agitating a campaign against the Mahdi in Morocco. They are practically all agreed that France is preparing for the subjugation and annexation. They further state the reports that the lives of the Europeans in Fez are in danger. The 'Frankfurter Volkszeitung' asserts that France is embarking on an adventure contrary to the Algerian Treaty and that not by any means if she is roughly restrained of a Franco-German partition of Morocco.

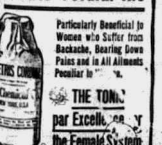

The Government's Land Policy.

In the high jump, as in the other field events, the importance of style cannot be overestimated. An athlete may have every natural advantage in nerve and ability for the high jump, but if he has not the best way to jump he cannot do his best.

The most natural style of high jump is what may be called the scissors jump. This style is usually of doubtful origin, as it is only an improvement on the former style of jumping. 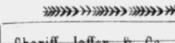
