#### Braking the Car.

Although there is many drivers who when it would be difficult to find fault, it is certain that, if fault could be found, it would be in connection with their method of braking the car. It is only very little realized how much strain can be thrown on the chassis and the tyres owing to the violent application of the brakes and the undue wear occasioned to the tyres. Neither is it generally appreciated that shock absorbers are an essential braking method. The brake therefore should only be applied just so much as will ensure rapid but safe application without locking. The ideal method of driving is to use the brakes just as little as possible, allowing the car to coast to a stop, but in such a manner as to absorb any momentum. It is much better to allow the car to roll up to a house so that it comes to rest at the desired point than to approach at speed and then brake heavily in order to stop at the desired point. From the points of view of both drivers and passengers it is much more careful to drive smoothly and avoid anything sudden, thereby never creating the impression that a mishap has been narrowly averted.

#### On Handbrake.

The many cars the hand brake is fitted with the idea that it will be used only for holding the car when it is at rest and many otherwise good cars are spoiled in this respect, starting an unnecessary race on the market at a competitive price. The ideal is aim at it is to use both the hand and foot brakes in the manner when descending hills. Omitting to use the hand brake is apt to make the driver forget that the extra brake is there in case of emergency. When the hand brake is obviously only for use when stationary it is not desirable to use it in the event of a long periods when the car is in motion. With a normal hand brake, however, full use can be made of it either when slowing down when there is plenty of warning or for retarding the motion of the car when descending hills. Incidentally it is well never to use the hand brake ratchet when employing the hand brake for stopping the momentum of the car. #### The Ignition Lever.

Another real test of the skilled driver lies in his use of the ignition lever, mixture control and the extra air inlet. Knocking of the engine should always be avoided. #### Road Sense.

Well measured driving, which is closely bound up with that subtle quality "road sense," simply amounts to consideration for other road users, and is not confined not only of leading motorists and other wheeled traffic but also pedestrians. To deal first with speeding. Nothing gets pedestrians more into disrepute than speeding, especially in places where the ordinary traffic conditions involving footpaths, walls, do not warrant it or where amorphous traffic conditions. Similarly any excessive noise such as an excess exhaust or a too loud sounding warning device should be avoided. In France it is not permitted to use stationary hooters in towns, only bulb horns or jet-toned electric horns of the American type being permitted. There is a lesson here which might well be taken to heart by motorists who may have occasion to pass through residential areas. A full hour for returning to rest. Although it is very nice to have really good headlights when driving at night, they are unnecessary if they are not illuminated by street lamps, a measure which would well be adopted even here in Nairobi.

#### Using the Motor.

Some drivers think that it is a good thing to smother the horn on any conceivable occasion but I maintain that one should learn to use the horn very judiciously. There are cases in which a sudden blurt from a warning device may do more harm than good, and may startle an oncoming pedestrian or lurching taxi in front of the car, where he or she would normally have passed safely on to the rear. The oncoming pedestrian should always be sounded car approaching cross roads or dangerous corners that a just sufficient sound the driver should be able for the possible sound of another horn from a car approaching from one of the side roads. The horn should be sounded also when overtaking another car.

#### Overtaking Traffic.

A lot of instances of injury motorists is accustomed when being overtaken by, or overtaking another car. A certain type of driver exists, who for some unknown reason, will never allow another car to pass by him. He may be holding to a certain speed and hold no wish to drive faster, yet that is the sound of the horn in taking car will cause him to accelerate and enter into what becomes a race. If you do not wish to force this on to your own side, the right of way then overtakes him in turn and keep well ahead of him. Make driving as easy for alternatives as you would wish them to make it for you. Never obstruct either an overtaking or approaching vehicle. Draw well in to the right side of the road and, if overtaking, avoid cutting back to your own side of the road too rapidly.

#### Ousting In.

It is quite in order to overtake other cars proceeding in the same direction but one should never cut back sharply in front of another car in such a way that his car may be in order to avoid damage to his car. For this reason it is extremely inadvisable to attempt to overtake another car if the leading vehicle approaching from the opposite direction within the road is very close. Particular attention should be given to this point in poor weather when a skid may be caused to your own car, making the car too much to steer. By any means, do not attempt to force any kind of movement, whether it is slowing down, turning or stopping, nor should your movements be sudden.

#### Four Wheel Brakes.

Always brake gently. Front wheel brakes which are driven by the same motor should not be used. With four wheel brakes one should brake no more suddenly than one would if he were using only two wheels. In other words, only

## ENGINE VIBRATION.

### Interesting Investigation of a Problem.

MANNER AND REASON.

Engine vibration is a subject to which a great deal of attention has been devoted in the past, and it is likely once again to become prominent for two reasons: first, the continual increase in the rate of rotation of the power units is itself liable to lead to increased vibrational forces, and, secondly, the enclosed type of body is gaining in popularity and is apt to amplify any vibrations which may be present.

Thus, a power unit which may appear to run with sufficient smoothness when fitted to an open touring car may prove to be almost unshakably rough if the same element be fitted with a saloon body. Engine vibrations, which were not previously felt, will then resound in the bodywork and will give rise to various objectionable noises, such as rattling windows.

By the use of sufficiently abstract mathematics the scientist can estimate the force at which the importance with regard to this vibration problem, but to the average man, a more practical demonstration of the force at which it is preferable; consequently, a recent research carried out in America is of more than usual interest owing to the fact that instruments were used to record the vibrations of actual engines in a form which can readily be grasped.

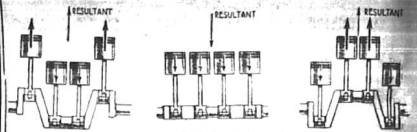

portance in a four-cylinder engine are caused by what is known as the secondary unbalance forces. Without going too far into the technicalities of the subject, the presence of these forces may be explained by reference to the diagram reproduced, which shows the four pistons in various positions. In the first case we have one of the dead centres at which point each piston is endeavouring to continue to move in the direction which it was previously following, but is restrained from so doing by the connecting rods and crankshaft. This is to say, the two pistons at the top are pulling upwards. The important point is that the motion imparted by a crank and connecting rod is such that the pistons at the top pull with a greater force than those at the bottom. Consequently, the net result is an upward pull on the crankshaft and, of course, tends to lift the whole engine.

**VARIATIONS IN SPEED.**  
Now suppose that the crankshaft is revolved through a quarter of a revolution so that all the pistons are on one level. When a quarter turn is completed, the two pistons which have moved downwards have been brought up to their maximum speed and in this position above, have actually commenced to slow down again. Consequently, they are pressing downwards with an increasing resistance their previous velocity. The upwardly moving pistons, on the contrary, have not yet reached their maximum speed and are resisting the retarding force in their endeavour not to increase their velocity. The net result is a downward load on the crankshaft

up by the pistons, so that they do not cause vibration of the engine. Besides the action of the secondary loaded drums rotating at the crankshaft speed, the unbalanced load of the drums producing vibration on the upward and downward strokes, one acting in opposition to the other set up by the pistons. Another point is that, quite apart from the action of the pistons already described, the pistons describe considerable outward forces in the connecting rods which also tend to bend the crankshaft and cause it to vibrate. The obvious remedy for this defect is to fit balance weights opposite the crankshaft. It is worth noting that a feature of the six-cylinder type of engine is the complete absence of vibration due to secondary forces, owing to the motion of the pistons is such that they serve to balance one another.

Turning to the twisting of the crankshaft and the internal reaction of torsional vibrations, a series of charts was obtained. From a fairly rough crankshaft at different speeds, the greatest twist was 0.2 p.m. almost a perfect circle was obtained, showing the entire absence of torsional vibrations. At 1,400 r.p.m. the twist was 0.4 p.m. in the circle, showing that at times in the revolution did the crankshaft twist and untwist. Only at 2,000 r.p.m. was the twist vibration five and a half times non-effective unit, at 2,500 r.p.m., it begins again in a reverse sense until 3,100 r.p.m. is reached. At this point fairly severe vibration occurs, there being six pronounced bumps on the crank-

It will, therefore, be seen that there is an alternate upward and downward pull going on the crankshaft. In other words, if a crankshaft is rotating at 1,000 r.p.m., then there will be an upward pull on the engine 2,000 times per minute and a downward thrust occurring with equal frequency.

Furthermore, as the forces are not in line with one another they will have a definite bending effect on the crankshaft, so that this part of the engine may produce vibrations of its own. This bending effect was recorded by the first instrument, which was connected with which it was found that the crankshaft of an ordinary engine vibrates up and down with considerable force.

It is very interesting to notice that the actual amount by which the crankshaft bends at the centre is about one-eighth of an inch at two-hundredths of an inch at high engine speeds, due to this type of loading.

**REDUCTION VIBRATION.**  
There are several ways in which the amount of up-and-down vibration can be minimized in a four-cylinder engine. The magnitude of the secondary forces can be reduced by employing as long a connecting rod as possible consistent with the need for making the engine fairly compact. Furthermore, the vibration present is often caused by gas owing to the fact that the pistons are not completely sealed. The gas pressure in the combustion chamber tends to escape in the form of a jet and is subject to various shocks and impulses in the form of a jet, which is liable to vibrate the engine.

What is actually happening is that the various loads on the crankpins due to explosion, compression and inertia forces, tend to twist the crankshaft like a coil spring. The twisting may be in one way or the other. In other words, the crankshaft winds and unwinds as it rotates. The twisted and untwisted condition of the crankshaft tends to vibrate. When this twisting step occurs the vibration increases in intensity, as is shown by the graphs.

Another interesting point is shown from a study of this diagram. At the higher speed there are six bumps on the curve showing a rate of vibration of 0.2, 100-12,000 times per minute. At the lower speed the maximum figure is only 13,600. In other words, the rate of vibration of the shaft is only by the same in each case, and the same amount of vibration of the applied force compared with the natural frequency of the shaft.

Other deductions are that, for example, one can estimate that there may be a still higher speed at which the resonant motion would be increased, and that the rate of vibration of the shaft would be increased. It is probable that the shaft would vibrate less if it were to rotate more slowly. As regards the amount of vibration, the research to which you have referred shows that the maximum amount of vibration is about 0.2 p.m. in the circle, which is about the same as the amount of vibration of the shaft.

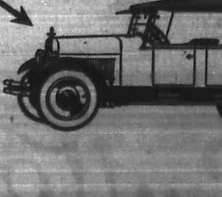
