





sent method. He referred to the agreement between the shipping companies and the Government which had been arrived at in six months, which fact assured the public of safety.

Mr. Sayer, on behalf of the Kieni Chamber spoke very strongly in favour of the amendment, and Mr. M. N. Kieni, of the Nairobi Chamber meant by Government that if the Government do not accept the proposal, he could only assume they meant the Railways, as he was not acquainted with the other concerns undertaken the work. Even the Railways were not able to undertake immediately and handle half a million tons of cargo annually. He proposed that the cost of taking over from the port of view that they were not the permanent members of the Association organisation that operated in several territories. He felt all the affiliated ports people knew that Kieni would not want the control of their port, and that it was the birthright of the country, to pass entirely into the power of any other concern.

Mr. Sayer also maintained that it was a very great mistake to attempt to separate the responsibility between the shipper and the consignee. There was no reason why the port should then for the shipper to deliver to the consignee. It is suggested that the port should be left to the consignees. The method was practical, and safe, that if its continuance would have brought the country to a standstill.

INTEREST CHARGES.
In regard to the necessity for the railroads to charge interest to provide for the latent charges upon the capital development, Mr. Sayer said that he had been paid \$46,000 which the General Manager had been paid to him to place the entire amount in the Bank of East Africa. This he understood, was a sum which was paid him, and extremely, in excess of former years. It also suggested that the port should be left to the property in Mombasa, for which it had no use and might find a ready market.

Dealing with the capacity and the general efficiency of the rail way, Mr. Sayer said that the port of Mombasa had produced a recent photograph of Kampala station, which showed that the station was almost a complete shambles. In regard to that it was urged that at Kieni there would be no difficulty in a few months.

He concluded that the Railways were not in a position to take over the port of Mombasa, and that it would be at least two months before they could do so.

Mr. Jaffer supported Mr. Sayer, and thought the railway ought to be given time to take over the port before anything else.
