**MOTURING TOPICS**

**NIGHT DRIVING.**

**How to Handle a Car Safely After Dark.**

**FOCUSSED AND DAZZLING.**

There is a certain fascination about night driving which only the most blasé motorists fail to note. It is a wonderful sight to see the glow of the headlights, the gleam of the car lights, and the red and green lights of the traffic, all so clearly visible in the darkness.

**PROPER FOCUSSED.**

Nothing is more fatal to safe night driving than bad focusing of the headlights. It is a common fault to see the beams of light focused too high or too low, or to see the beams of light focused too far or too near.

The average modern lamp has what is called a parabolic reflector, which is so designed that it reflects the rays of light coming from the filament placed at the focal point in a concentrated parallel beam.

The focusing of headlights is affected by a variety of methods, the most common is a screw or wheel which can be turned and which can be moved in and out of the reflector.

It is offered sometimes to turn the lamp up or down by means of a screw or lever in the side of the lamp. Another method of providing these facilities is in the form of a knob on the top of the lamp, which can be turned by the hand of the driver.

No very type of bulb will suit certain headlights for if the filament is placed too far from the reflector, the beam will be too wide. The distance between the filament and the reflector is probably the most important factor in the design of the lamp. It is always best to have the filament as near as possible to the focal point of the reflector. This will give the most powerful beam from the lamp.

**THE DAZZLE QUESTION.**
