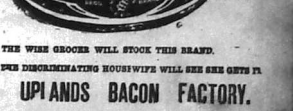

STRAIGHT TALKS ON LABOUR.

No. 6.

IMPORTANCE OF MEAT IN NATIVE DIETARY.

The following series of articles under the supervision of the subject of labour conditions formed by a group of the staff of the Kenya Agricultural Department who have been carrying out an investigation, on behalf of Government, on the Lines of South Africa, Rhodesia, and the Belgian Congo. The article will be published each week.

I have been informed that, some careless phrases in my last week's article might easily lead to a misunderstanding. I think the criticism is perfectly justified and am therefore going to leave the discussion of such over till next week when we clear the ground about the food question.

The misconception that I appeared to print the finger of scorn at meat as an article of diet, I hasten to state, with all possible emphasis, that I need no more say this respectably of the meat food of our English or even the second hand of Keryp; than I would of the vulture.

Leaving the theory of the whole affair quite out of the question for some, in actual fact, a man cannot eat enough of any available vegetable to supply his needs as regards protein. Even if he were to eat every one of the little fish in the pond, they will not do him good. That is if they are looked upon as the sole source of a man's protein. They will supply a part, and an important part, of what is required but they cannot do everything. It is the same trouble as with the maize crop again. We considered some weeks ago the incredible amount of sugar or oil this would have to be eaten to give a man the chemical constituents that he needs. The maize contains to pounds and pounds, and simply men's to consumed even with the best will in the world on the part of the eater. It is much the same with beans.

In the late war the German Government did the same thing about beans that nothing could out. It is a bigger ration was issued the balance was shown away. This being the case it is clearly no use

trying to make up the whole of the protein part of the ration out of beans alone. It simply cannot be done. The daily ration of beans or ground peas of both is excellent and should be used. But these things cannot and will not, in practicable quantities, give enough protein for a healthy man.

THE VITAMIN C QUESTION.

If the answer to the vitamin C question is a lemon, the real trouble is not in the protein problem is real. In it we have some of the best produce in the world, in a more acceptable form, so concentrated that the requisite amount can easily be consumed and we have a good deal of vitamin just in the rind.

If objection be raised, as it sometimes is to the amount of acid content of ascorbic acid, most provides a quick way out of the difficulty. If your ration contains enough meat you can wash out all other acids as protein right away. Meat must be difficult to get. That of course, depends on all sorts of factors such as the pressure of game and the absence of game reserves, and so on. But as a rule, meat can be got if it is really wanted. The European lion or other, and he can get it for his labour if he tries hard enough.

Nearly every one realizes that meat is good food and if there is plenty of it and it is cheap it is dear or hard to get that any objection to it is raised.

It is just, but that there has been getting meat. This difficulty seems in a fair way to being overcome. Dressed meat of excellent quality—according to samples received—now being manufactured at Mwanza and is actually on the market.

PRESERVED MEAT.

It is not third meat, nor letting me mention, but a solid and partially dried product that seems to retain most of the qualities and has the appearance of freshly killed meat. It is said to keep certainly for three months and probably for a year and it can be transported in sacks or baskets or something like that and requires no special containers. It occurs in pieces of between about half and one pound weight which represent from one and a half to three pounds of ordinary fresh meat. An important point is that, in the sample, inspected, there was a considerable amount of fat which is apparently left unchanged by the process employed in manufacture. As it is estimated that one pound


of the preserved meat is equal to about three of fresh meat, considerably saving in transport charges should prove to be one of the pleasant but not too frequent places where meat transport is set on the hoof.

And this should really be enough for the present on the subject of food. It is true the clear the African continent to the entire population that European can be better than that he can get locally—the honey bee who eats of his honey, that he can get locally—a fairly wholesome, man-made, too common, but the maker's taste, does not, on a stick. It is something like the frequency that the labourer on the maize does.

But the doctors did themselves well to the dink for meat and bread, two things that most natives think they presumably consumed in addition to the ration that were issued to them. One cannot be sure that the whole of this very obvious difference between the civilized and the non-African was entirely due to food but there is no doubt that his improved feeding was an important contributing factor. Instances of corresponding medical cases in the picture as well as the general state of his health in every way. But for all that the point where the greatest difference was apparent was in the feeding. It is quite clear that, if we are to expect good work from a man, we must feed him well.

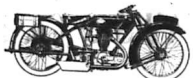

Whilst it is true that some excellent cinematographs of production do come from America they are rare and the great mass of pictures produced by Los Angeles have been either altogether stupid and unappealing or the medium for the expression of the most spectacular, frequently very much as can make little, if any, appeal to the majority of the British people, who often they waste only idly. Although until recent times the cinema industry was practically the monopoly of American producers, no effort was made to grasp the taste of people outside the United States, with the result that generally there appeared the most glaring inconsistencies, especially noticeable and deplorable when the subject of the picture dealt with British history. Some time ago a cinema exhibition at the Metropolitan British Institute was "day" by the film results which led to the suggestion of literature to be sent to those who had seen it and another aspect of a favorite work can only be described as marvellous. Britainers are often accused

of similar prejudices; whatever it is noticeable that any prejudice is in evidence in hand with such ignorance as that applied to the Livingston film producer who found that the American film industry had not the slightest idea who the great David Livingstone was. It is so though some British business men should not.

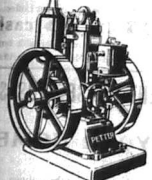

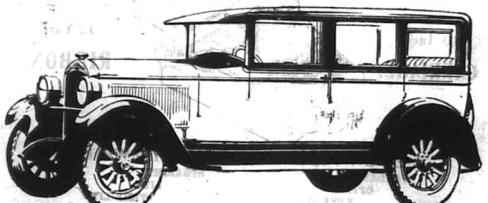

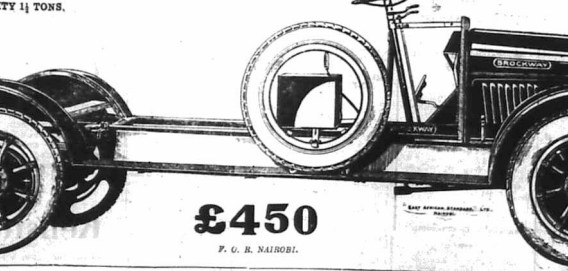

MOTURING TOPICS

GEAR CHANGING.

Reglet Often Results in Accident.

A GREAT TEMPTATION.

This article will not interest the man who habitually drives a big car with an engine of large capacity capable of revving along to top gear at the rate of one second per revolution without changing down, or so gradually directed downwards that the car is still in gear at the moment of anything up to a three fold weight increase between 15 cwt. and 25 cwt. weight.

The advantages of such small cars—handiness, economical running and so on—do not require to be particularly recognized that their performance largely depends upon the one which the driver makes of the gearbox.

AN IMPORTANT ASPECT.

Using the gear to avoid over-revving the engine, but to improve the average speed attained has a still more important aspect in this subject—namely, that the driver may make a practice of changing down frequently is not nearly so unwise, as the man who likes to hang on to top gear so long as the engine will move the car.

The small-capacity engine depends upon "revs," for its power output, and consequently the top-gear acceleration of the light car, when getting away from a stop, is, in a way, only half the figure which is attainable by using second gear.

Consequently, the man who is a pleasure driver in the town who is severely handicapped should, as a necessary emergency step, simply increase the acceleration of his command to no more than what it changes down in good time, so as to have infinitely better performance available.

To quote a common example: The motor-driver of a small car may often be seen following a heavy commercial vehicle along a country road at about 12 m.p.h. in

top gear, patiently waiting for an opportunity to pass. Again, as he will drive out to the end of the road, only to fall back owing to a blind corner or some other obstruction he cannot avoid.

Finally, he gets his chance, but his acceleration is so poor that the operation of passing takes a considerable time during which the whole road is blocked by other traffic. The correct procedure is to change down to second gear at the moment to pass, then to shift directly to top gear, thus maintaining the acceleration for much more rapidly.

Changing down on hills is another point. Many light fit drivers taking risks which they would never contemplate but for their desire to avoid changing down. If proof of this statement be required, the reader should proceed by a locality where a steep downward gradient is followed by an equally steep rise and where, conventionally wound off the foot of the dip there is a cross-roads or some similar danger point.

"CHANGING" THE CROSS-ROADS.

Non light car drivers out of town will go over the cross-roads at a much greater speed than can be safely done, simply because they wish to rank the race which follows so as to avoid changing down. The writer has been out with drivers who are usually most careful in the negotiation of cross-roads, and has seen them do these things people succumb to the temptation to "change it" in the circumstances described.

Another case where a refusal to change gear often leads to accidents is at any rate, difficulties of all associated, is on a hill top, where the degree of steepness which can be negotiated by the average light car, at top gear, is a speed of 20 to 25 miles per hour. The difficulty arises when, on a slight rise, the driver finds it difficult to make his car go up the hill, and he is tempted to change down. In such circumstances the rate at which the motor is passing the slower one is, of course, reduced and so they continue up the hill, unconsciously taking an upward precaution; may well

be caused by the sudden appearance of an approaching roadster, passing a local abut.

If he takes time, the driver who is contemplating to pass on a narrow, apply his brakes and fall back. Instead, the driver, who should be able to do so, is in a position which will be no means one should proceed, as he is on the off side of the road, with no additional speed or acceleration at his command. Had he changed down before attempting to pass the other car, no difficulty would have arisen.

IN TOWN.

In driving a small car through the streets of a town, the advantages of changing down frequently are still more marked. Stopping traffic can be passed more readily, the rear side of the road being regarded in a shorter space of time, and a better grip being made from traffic lights.

Then, again, when passing out of a town, and crossing the main stream of traffic, it is the foolish policy of many drivers—taken about 15 m.p.h. in top gear, cause the necessary warning on brake order that the driver who is emerging from the beyond must save time.

The correct procedure, of course, is to engage a gear or before the corner is reached, to drop down to some slowly making sure that the corner is clear before attempting to cross the main road. If you are one in the way the acceleration available on the lower gear will enable the car to get quickly across, and the whole process will take no more time than that occupied by the average light car.

Many more instances could be pointed to show the policy of "top changing," and the wisdom of changing down. This practice is a common number of examples have been given to illustrate the point, it is of course, more difficult to change gear on some cars than on others, but ambitious practice should make any driver to become after the handling of his car is a more joyous and safer position than before—"The Motor."

ENGINE STALLING.

DO NOT USE THE CHOKE WHEN RE-WINDING.

If the engine stalls while running along the road, the best use of the choke when cranking again, is to use it for a moment, to give the engine to start, and then to open it so quickly when cranking is over, as to reach the mixture to a point where it will not burn. Under such conditions the engine will not start at all, even if the cause of the original stall is found, so that, as most small cars cylinders have been thoroughly cleaned, to this open the pet-cocks and crank the engine with the throttle closed.

LOOSE PLOGS.

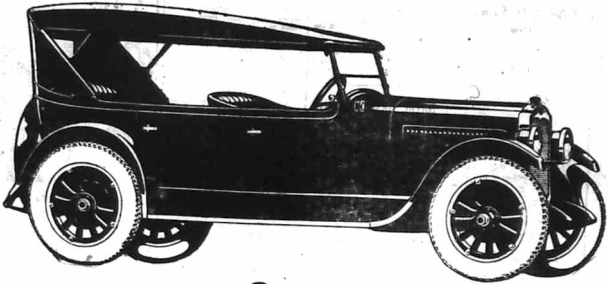

GROWING TOURIST TRAFFIC IN UGANDA.

How it Affects Railway Plans for the Future.

HOTELS PROBLEM.

Must Be Combined With Other Developments.

The growing tourist traffic in Uganda is commented upon by Major Hinde, Acting General Manager of the Railway in the course of the last part of the review of the recent year of the railway system in Uganda which is published to-day.

There is, as a fact, a serious aspect of the development of the services on Lake Albert, which is worthy of consideration, and this is tourist traffic. Tourists are coming through from the Sudan annually in increasing numbers, most of whom at present have to find their way overland by land routes. If proper facilities were provided for an increasing number of lake services, it is almost certain that the Sudan Government would make use of the river and lake services. It is almost certain that the Sudan Government contemplate building a road to Nandi, and this is likely to increase the tourist traffic, but it seems that we ought to consider if something more definite should not be undertaken by the Railway Administration to cope with such traffic. As above stated, the lake side good accommodation on the Nile itself, from the point on Lake Albert where the Nile leaves the Lake, there is a trip of some four hours across the Lake to Haidah, and for this there is the "Samuel Baker" from Butabwa towards there is a motor service through Masindi to Masindi Port, whence ships on Lake Kioga are available for onward transit.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATION.

The provision of suitable hotel accommodation, not only at changing stations, but at points where tourists are likely to be attracted by scenery or for other reasons, is a very important factor in connection with the encouragement of such traffic. There are now few hotels in Kenya, and the provision of suitable accommodation appears to be so important that it may be necessary for the Railway Administration to develop a special department to deal with the question. If there are no suitable hotels available, tourist traffic is unlikely to develop appreciably. The capital required for such a purpose need not actually be a very large sum, but it is necessary for consideration to be given to the country generally, by most tourists also eventually being given to the country. The future of Lake Kioga and the Lake Albert services may, therefore, for something as follows:—

- (1) The need for a Marine Service on Lake Kioga will be stimulated by the extension of the Railway to the north of the lake, as there is likely to be considerable coastal lake traffic. In addition to through traffic to Lake Albert for the Congo.
- (2) The service on Lake Kioga may possibly be eliminated, but the Lampi district will probably require steam for a considerable time.
- (3) Lake Albert may require another steamer, and the question is revolving construction. The ship being constructed for the Nile should be suitable for passenger traffic, and the lighters now existing or being erected on Lake Albert are sufficient for cargo traffic on that lake at present.
- (4) Belgian traffic through Masindi should be increased if possible, and traffic to Masindi and other ports round Lake Albert should be developed.

(5) Tourist trade to and from the Sudan ought to be developed, this may entail the extension of Lake Victoria to the Railway Administration.

THE SOUTHERN HALF OF THE LAKE.


The points touched on in the southern shore of Lake Victoria in our tour were Masindi, Masindi and Bukoba. Masindi and Bukoba the roads are good, but there is no road communication with Masindi or any point on the Tanganyika Railway. Masindi, therefore, there is also a good road system through Masindi for road traffic. I believe, no communication with Masindi or the Railway except by the Lake.

There is evidently plenty of scope for development on the southern shore of Lake Victoria, and the Kenya and Uganda Railways hope to be able to play a large part in this development.

The object of the Railway Administration will be to arrange in cooperation with the Tanganyika Government as a subsidiary, so that which already exists with the Government to erect a rapid expansion of trade production at the south end of Lake Victoria during the next few years. The development of the southern shore of the Lake must depend to a large extent on the joint development of Lake and road transport for motor traffic, and this is a true whether the Shinyanga-Masindi line is constructed immediately or not. Experience in Uganda has shown that the economic limit for motor transport for motor is, as a rule, about thirty to forty miles from the nearest railway station or lake port. With certain use of bus, motor, smaller, and smaller still, with less valuable and more bulky crops, it is fairly safe to assume that, as a general rule, a railway and feeder roads do not serve a larger area as regards agricultural production than about fifty miles on each side of the line. If this is so, the Shinyanga-Masindi line would serve a belt of, roughly, a hundred miles in breadth in the centre of the southern littoral of the Lake, while the total area requiring transport facilities amounts to several hundreds of miles, and in any case, the railway could not serve the areas on the Masindi side and Masindi on the road to the Spoke Gulf.

The Marine Service at the southern end of the Lake can be developed without further capital expenditure on ships, tug boat lighters, when the main existing

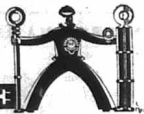

In our issue of yesterday they appeared a report of a fresh charge in the Magistrate's Court, in which six small native boys pleaded guilty to stealing several dozen socks from an Indian store on Simbaia evening. From their attitude in the dock it was quite evident that they did not realise the gravity of their offence, and it was not until the Magistrate sentenced each of them to ten strokes with a cane that their souls faded away.

The appearance of such youthful criminals in the dock has a very special significance, especially at the present time. On all hands there are complaints as to the growing lawlessness of the native community, and it is in fact the children who are being offered in evidence of their crime.

It is a pity that the children of this class of labour in a town like Nairobi. It must be felt by everybody that the Magistrate's action in ordering a whipping, treating these little rogues as vagrants, and sending them back to their parents, is a wise and judicial action. Every effort should be made to prevent boys of so irresponsible an age from coming within the lawless grasp of a town. Having once embarked on a career of crime, these youngsters are never likely to cease the practice, and can only grow from bad to worse, and form material for the Indeterminate sentence. It is to be seriously hoped that when the new legislation relating to the registration of workless and vagrant natives comes into force, that the authorities will pay special regard to the numerous native children who are the cause of so much trouble to the police and to the community.

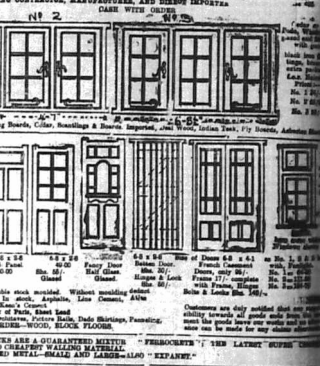

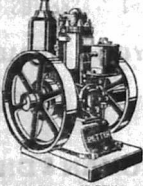

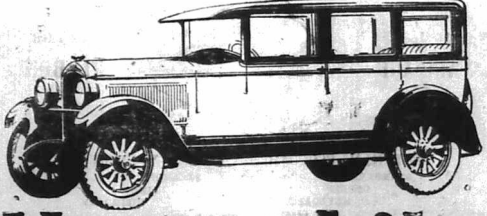

If, however, you retain a prejudice against mixing, you may find a tulle frock with a flower or a ribbon.

See material with a hand, you may have a two-piece suit of tulle and lined with a wide, hand-printed flanne. Military Modes

All many of the recent "show" in the mannequins have illustrated a pretty new motif. Long strips of ribbon, matching the hat are tied in a bow at the left of the neck. The little bow has long trailing ends reaching down to the hip line. This length has long important points, and the fashion may be very feminine and graceful on the right wearer when this material is well served. Ends that are too short appear success in looking "stiff," and the very reverse of "chic." Another point in favor of this trailing streamer is the worth of firm femininity they impart to the severely sketched silhouette, without spoiling the "cleanness" of the contour.

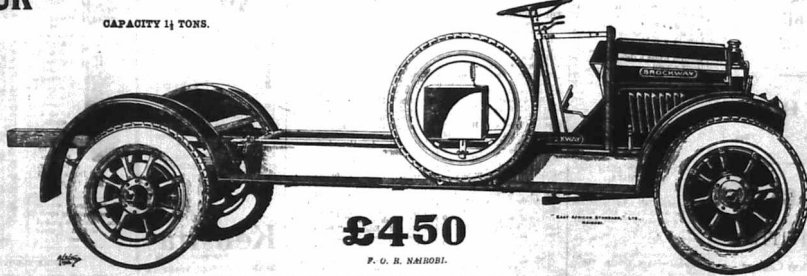
