The following is the report of the directors of the Magadi Soda Co., Ltd., which has been prepared for presentation at the Annual Meeting of the Company, and which is signed by Mr. Alfred Mend, as Chairman:

The Profit and Loss Account and the Balance Sheet, certified by the auditors, are presented. This Statement of Profit for the year ended 31st December, 1925, of £25,077 before charging Debenture Interest and Income Tax, if any.

PROFIT DEFICIENT

The Debenture holders and Preference Shareholders are reminded that, under the Scheme of Arrangement approved by the Court, the Preference Shares are, for the year under review, only of the amount year, payable 10 per cent. of the profit for the year, after the amount of the 1925 has been set aside for Income Tax. The amount of the 1925 has not yet been ascertained by the Revenue Authorities, but if after adjustments for depreciation or otherwise have been made in settling the accounts, profit any balance of the above amount of £20,000 provided for contingencies and renewals remains, the balance will have to be added to the profit.

DEBENTURES DIVIDEND

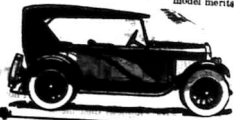

"A Won Wonder" on the subject of rickets will not do any one any harm. I am not scientific enough to be able to say if disease is hereditary, but from experience I am inclined to think it may be.

A puppy who goes to six months old is clever and will never get it. Rickets are usually developed in the nest, and up to 2 1/2 months old. I have received many dogs books on the subject and all more or less unsatisfactory. The ordinary "vet." will tell you it is entirely preventable. This definite statement I decline to accept. The disease can be induced through ignorance of breeders or lack of care and proper feeding of the puppies. It is not only lack of proper feeding that induces rickets, but that is why disease is preventable.

In some puppies it commences at four to five weeks old, but is not very noticeable until two to 2 1/2 months. The puppies are weak and will become irregular in stool. The patient very weak and in bad cases vomit and ground. The books are described bones of the fore-limb may become visible and in very bad cases rickets is curable.

Causes: Want of fresh air and liberty—proper feeding, and worms. This does not cover it in its entirety in the least, and it is to me of this condition. I am sure I can feed to cure them if it were not for the fact that I am sure that a well-bred puppy, and a better breeder it could have been had to find. 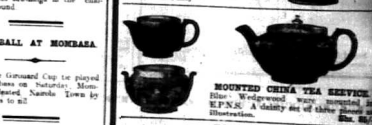

MOTOR TRANSPORT.

The Six-Wheel Vehicle Produced.

CROSS COUNTRY WORK.

No more attention has been devoted during recent years to the production of six-wheeled motor vehicles, to consider how an apparatus comparable to a conventional six-wheeled design can be produced in practice.

Six-wheelers are built in two broad and distinct types for at least two equally distinct purposes. The object of the former type of vehicle is to provide a vehicle which will carry and haul a very large load without a reasonable limit of axle weight being exceeded. The type has a great advantage over an ordinary tractor in that a trailer is coupled because much of the load has to be under tension of the driving wheels. Also the flexible six-wheeler is much easier to manoeuvre than is a combination of tractor and trailer.

assumed that expansion is provided by means of a single articulated section. The axle on each side of the frame by a conventional axle. In this case, the axle on each side will be attached to a link for forward axle bracket. The whole arrangement amounts to something not unlike a bogey on the forward end of a railway locomotive. The particular point to be noted is that the connection to the frame is half way between the two rear axles.

Another important point, if the vehicle is to be used for cross-country work, is that a supplementary gear box should be provided. If the ordinary gear box gives four speeds, the effect of having the simple form of supplementary gear box also fitted is that five additional speeds are available. The extra range is obtained in comparatively low, with the result that power while the vehicle is travelling very slow over rough soil is maintained, at the same time, that the vehicle is on a good lined track, quite high speeds are possible. This we have a vehicle well suited for cross-country work and yet equally well suited for ordinary work where hard roads exist. If part of our transport has to be on rough ground and the other part under conditions, we can save money and spend all the time in order to have a machine which will operate satisfactorily under the worst possible conditions.

The design of a rigid six-wheeler of heavier weight than ordinary factory makes provision was made for the full independence of movement of the two driving axles. Obviously, if the vehicle is to be used in the ordinary sense of the word, then, when travelling over rough soil, the weight of the whole would be in the air or, at any rate, would not be bearing their proper share of the load. With the method of springing described briefly above, this does not happen. The vehicle has freedom of movement independent of one another. Thus, one of the driving wheels, when the vehicle is on rough ground, may be almost completely lifted, while the rear one continues to run on the same solid road level. Despite this freedom of motion, the freedom of movement is such

that both wheels will remain on the ground and will share of the load.

A little thought will readily show that such a vehicle is a big advantage over an ordinary four-wheeler. Though the rigid six-wheeler is very different in appearance from the ordinary motor vehicle, it is no more "experimental." Every one for years ago found to be true that the six-wheeler is not a frequent more, generally, the six-wheeler will be used in ever-increasing numbers by agriculturalists throughout the world and, in fact, by all who are faced with the need of economical transport where good hard roads are not everywhere available.

A single-cylinder internal combustion engine model having a cylinder capacity of 200 c.c. has been developed by the Liverpool. MOTERING TOPICS

COFFEE CULTIVATION.

An Interesting Demonstration at Kabeto.

On Wednesday last at the invitation of the Director of Agriculture, a large number of interested persons, who were interested in the efficiency of Coffee Plantations outside Kenya, from breaking new land to exhibition between numerous acres of land, were invited to see a fascinating demonstration of the latest Oliver machinery brought out to the Forebush Tractor.

The property chosen for these trials was that of Captain Victor Richard Mearns and only a quarter of an hour's run from here. This country is undulating and carries heavy crops. It is a very good coffee in various stages of maturity from recently planted paddocks covered. Examples of recent direct methods of planting are in width and pattern were ground and combined to make the demonstration system rapid and effective. Some of the latest ones seen on the outside system.

A narrow tread Fordson (40 in overall) was the machine power. With this an area was broken up in a few minutes. NEWSPAPER OPPOSITION TO THE PROHIBITION.

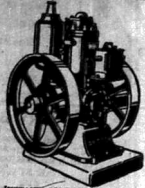

Demand for a Better Trade Policy.

SUGAR IMPORTS.

The tenth annual general meeting of the British Empire Producers' Organisation was held on Tuesday, July 5, at the offices of the Organisation, the Chairman, Mr. Geo. H. Morgan, presiding.

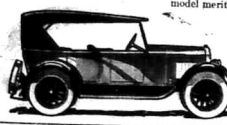

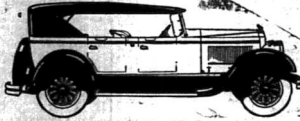

A Customs Union.

For a number of years endeavours have been made to reach agreement upon the basis of a complete Customs Union among the three assumed East African territories and it is disappointing to record that half of another year has gone without a solution being found. In his annual Report the Commissioner of Customs was able to report that at a Conference held in Dar-es-Salaam last year the foundation of a Customs Union for the three territories but the time has not yet arrived when uniformity has been reached. The Government Conference held out further hopes that steps would be taken in the desirable direction and the subject is again down for consideration at the Conference of official representatives to be held at Victoria Falls in September. At the present time, for as we understand the position from Special Compendium, the British has occurred in the mandated territory where the Government is apparently willing to enter into discussions but is desirous of retaining an independence in the fixation of tariffs which would make the scheme unworkable. Tanganyika, and Uganda will have a serious objection to raise to the policy of protection for some time and until a compromise can be effected it is still impossible to provide for the abolition of custom barriers between the territories which would render unnecessary the present machinery method whereby double payment

of duty is necessary and the internal trade of the countries is seriously handicapped. It is easy to see the force of the objection raised by the neighbouring territories. The community of which settlement steps provide the main source of supply for such an item as when flour and if we may assume to provide the main component of the internal East African market Tanganyika and Uganda not naturally object to being penalised for the sake of the slow development of an industry in the country. The same objections are raised to the trade in timber and until a working basis for agreement can be reached the protective policy is in serious jeopardy if the intention of completing a Customs Union is to be carried out. The percentage of divisible customs duty is not such a serious objection it has been arranged successfully between Kenya and Uganda for some years without any disagreement between the territories and the development of Mombasa revenue is the more imperative that similar agreement should be made in the case of the other territories. It is also available, at the moment, to be a complete answer to the objection that the East African Customs Department for the three territories, with a common tariff, a common customs legislation and management and subject to special provisions required and agreed to at all ports. The provisions of the mandate which allow of a common tariff and of a common administration in trade must also be considered but in the interests of the East African community generally it is to be hoped that with the beginning of another year the aim of a Customs Union will be fully realised. Commercially, throughout all the territories it is a considerable step to be made towards the abolition of mutual agreements and settlements to advance it ought to be possible to arrive at an agreement which can be done without any reference from outside, especially of influence the policy of East Africa will be the greater. The desire to

see the unification accomplished is in evidence in public and commercial circles in London as it is in East Africa but the last thing we would wish to see is a break of unity in Britain when it is possible in our opinion to derive a way of the present impasse. The position has materially improved. In the light of the recent preparation of a new Customs Administration Ordinance for Kenya and Uganda which will shortly close the lines of the excellent legislation in Tanganyika. The draft has been found acceptable by the Uganda Government and the present work has therefore for the completion of agreements between the territories at any later date leaves the door open for proper and progressive consideration of the outstanding difficulties. It is sometimes overlooked that the Uganda community, for instance, obtains a considerable advantage through proximity to the producing centres of the Kenya Highlands and were it more generally realised that this advantage would be shared by all the territories of the principle of protection of such articles as wheat flour, and dairy produce there would be less objection to the existing Kenya tariff. The barrier against importation of goods which would be produced equally well that of Kenya and it is also a fact that, owing to specially low export rates, Kenya butter can be brought more cheaply in Dar-es-Salaam than it can be in Mombasa. The maintenance of large building programmes in all three countries would receive give a special significance to the protection of goods of Kenya as a principle of self-sufficiency and independence and known of the other territories a Customs Union would be a step towards the abolition of Kenya is about to engage the services of a representative to the Railway is reported to have been arranged for the visit of an officer from the full knowledge of the rapid advancement of African timber. When the reports of those officers

are available on the general lines of the matter, the Kenya Government ought to be in a position to decide whether protection should be given to be sustained. For the rest, we are able to see why it is not possible to decide upon the main lines of Customs Union if it is agreed that pending recommendations the whole policy of protection. THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ENQUIRY

(FIRST ONE TWO (Continued))

At the meeting of the Standing Committee of the Local Government held last night, the following was discussed:

The Committee considered the report of the Enquiry into the Mombasa Waterworks, and decided to refer the report to the Council for their consideration.

Draperies Again.

The latest fad is a parting down the middle of the head from the forehead to the top of the neck. This parting is comb-like that hold the hair firmly apart.

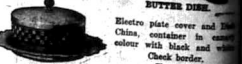
