

THE 'GREAT EARTHQUAKE IN UGANDA.'

People Awakened by Sound
of a Nightly Roar:

ALARMING NEW DEVELOPMENT.

Town Clerk Writes Home
To His Son.

[From Our London Correspondent.]

LONDON, Aug. 12.—On Sunday evening, "Great earthquake" was very severely experienced in Uganda, compared with earthquakes in Kenya. It was not until the morning of Monday that the exact cause of the tremor was known to be an earthquake.

It was the most violent since 1903, when there was

a shock of 5.5 on the Richter scale.

It started at 10.30 p.m. on Sunday evening, and

continued for about half an hour.


