

THE WAR.

New Designs.

EMPLOYING THE NAVY.

(Keppel's Special to "E. A. Standard.")
London, Nov. 1.

British Ambassador to the Italian Embassy in Rome has arrived there suddenly and with great secrecy. British Politics.

Cole Case in the Commons.

JUDGE'S REPORT.

London, Nov. 2.

British Subjects in Tripoli.

Colonies and Treaties.

(London, Nov. 2.)

Sir Edward Grey announces that the Imperial Government are approaching Columbia, Brazil, France, Mexico, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland and Venezuela regarding the position of the self-governing Colonies under Commercial treaties. He pointed out that he did not propose by this to negotiate a new Treaty but merely to give to the Dominions the right to draw from commercial treaties if they so desire.

Bombs from the Air.

(London, Nov. 1.)

Buster is informed that no airship has successfully dropped four bombs at the enemy's encampment at the back of Tripoli.

Turks Using Shells.

(Tripoli, Nov. 2.)

Russian agents state that the Turks during the last and the first a few shells into the trenches occupied by the Italians but the bombs remained undamaged. One shell which exploded in the trenches wounded seven Indians.

In Australia.

Closer Settlement.

(Melbourne, Nov. 3.)

The Hon. John Murray, Premier of Victoria, in outlining the programme of the Executive Council for Victoria said that the sole object before them was to keep the State in the lead in the movement for closer settlement. A number of skilled American agriculturists and were doing their utmost to interest and encourage the growing of sugar beets and to develop a market for every kind of dairy farmer. The progressiveness involved the promotion of closer settlement and assisting settlers to acquire lands and become private proprietors. His colleagues were considering the same question on the same basis as that now before the English Legislature.

Socialistic Banking.

(Melbourne, Nov. 1.)

Berliner Nov. 2

The Franco-German agreement with regard to Morocco is recognized as a complete victory for the League. France's protection of the League's interests, and the League's guarantee of the League's independence, and equality and freedom of control to all nationalities.

Berlin, Nov. 4

ROUNDS OF LANDOWNER'S RESIGNATION

(Leader's Special to "E. A. Standard.") London, Nov. 8
Mr. Balfour has resigned his leadership of the Unionist party.

He has caused the strongest surprise in the House of Commons and some consternation amongst Unionists, who are inclined to regard his reason as a mystery.

It is conjectured that Mr. Asquith Chamberlain has informed him that Mr. Lloyd George will be the next leader of the Liberal Unionists.

He has given his resignation at a special meeting of the executors of the City Conservative Association, which consists, with a number of city bankers and business men, of the most prominent Unionists.

He said he might enjoy health and activity for many years to come and would be in a position while still in health before he could be expected to suffer from the infirmities of old age which attacks men long in public service, who, without losing health and interest, are often unable to fulfil their duties in the old lines, are less able than younger men to adapt themselves to new conditions and to deal with new problems.

He hoped he had not reached the point of the margin to far. The only thing to do was to resign and let someone else take the leadership, and undoubtedly this was the last time as during next session the party would be in a position to nominate candidates.

Referring to the unrest in the party he declared that there was no difficulty in dealing with it and he had been in agreement with the state of parties which had been laid out of office in the last election to bring the best hope of success of the prospects.

Lord Lansdowne states that the rumour of his resigning negotiations is unfounded.

Balfour's Successor.

(London, Nov. 9.) A party meeting will be held at Carlton Club on November 13 to elect Mr. Balfour's successor.

Tariff Reform Banquet.

Austen Chamberlain's Speech.

(London, Nov. 9.) At a Tariff Reform League banquet given in the White City to Austen Chamberlain, yesterday evening, Mr. Austen Chamberlain, in a speech, gave an account of the financial misfortunes caused by the financial policy of the Government, and all personal considerations and he resolved that the forces of Unionism and the Conservative party must work together wherever the future leader might be to be successful.

The speaker said that when the Unionists were returned they would put forward a Tariff Reform Bill, and that the statue book without any further reference.

Italy's Rights over Tripoli.

An Italian resident in Johannesburg has supplied to the "Evening Chronicle" some notes on Tripoli which are most interesting. After discussing the various personalities involved in the dispute, he goes on to say that the necessity of extending her rights in Tripoli would be of great benefit to Italy in the southern shores of the Mediterranean and the Germanisation of Africa, the article concludes.

The Roman Empire occupied Tripoli up to 46 A.D., and the Saracens invaded it in 697 A.D. The Knights of St. John held it from 1144 A.D. until the Normans took it in 1190 A.D. The Turks held it from 1516 A.D. until 1835, when it fell under direct Turkish rule. It is now easier to reach the Turkish port of Tripoli than the Dardanelles, so that Turkey could not easily conquer it. Turkey could not easily prove, before an International Court, that she had the right to Tripoli, and was considered a dominant power by the Knights of St. John and the Holy Family, with consequent serious fights, pillages of towns, a long siege of Tripoli, and the loss of 100,000 lives. The Saracens also pillaged, so that their country fell into a very bad condition before the Saracens disappeared. She sent six ships to Tripoli, and the admiral, with a private, invited us board the ship. He said that the Saracens had been driven out without any suspicion; but as soon as he stepped on board the Saracens came alongside. He said that he was compelled, where he disengaged in the usual way, for fear of being captured by the Saracens. The Saracens were pursued down the Red Sea. Since then Turkey has occupied Tripoli.

Empire Cable Rates.

On concluding the operations of the Empire Posts Union, the institution's nominally circular, Mr. Kennedy Jones, the chairman, writes:—
"Believe me, the work of the Association is a success in the programme of the Empire Posts Union for the coming year. We have been able to increase our services in this direction. India has been reduced from 1 to 9d. South Africa from 1 to 9d. Canada from 1 to 9d. But we want more, and we won't be happy till we get it. We have been able to increase our services in Australia by at least 5d. per cent. On the State-owned cables we have increased our services in India so as to enable a distance of over 10,000 miles, namely the Atlantic, where the cable is 10,000 miles, to be covered in 55 hours, 55 a week to 3000 miles! If the Atlantic's cable ring, having covered everything, a State-owned cable can prove anything, a State-owned cable can prove that the Atlantic is proved."

"This is the last of our third year. It is the most promising year, and we are looking forward to it all. We are anxious about news supplies between all parts of the Empire; and I hope that the Empire Posts Union will be successful in its efforts to improve the services. For, however much we may labour for the service unity of the Empire Posts Union, it can never be fully achieved until we have established a few truly international supply of remittance rates, excepting iron and steel."

Discoveries in the City.

Naturalistic discoveries have been made during excavations in Tudor-street, E.C., for the new factory of Mawson & Sons. Amongst the finds were the skeletons of various kinds of animals, fragments of green pottery, a human skull and a fragment of a bone vessel. The small and wavy pieces used in the construction of the Palace of Westminster, which is 12th King John's parchment manuscript, a parchment of 1100 pages, and the seals and monograms before the proceedings terminated. The green pottery was found in the debris of the building, and there was no common use in the Inns of Court after 1666. In February 1560, it was entered that from henceforth there should be no more stone or lime brought into the tower to be stored in green ovens, both of winter and summer, and that the same should be delivered to the tower house daily at the time of the Roman compass.
