

MOTORING TOPICS

COMFORT IN DRIVING.

Obtaining the Ideal Position.

PROPER CONTROL.

Considerable driving room is safe driving, says the Motor. Unless the driver can see the road, he cannot judge the position and steering wheel, and the vehicle will not respond to him. In this case, the driver's eyes are not directed forward, and the steering wheel is not held firmly enough.

There is no doubt that many drivers have been converted to the fact that in a sudden emergency the automobile can be controlled much better if the driver has a clear view of the road ahead.

using as quickly as an ordinary car as might have done.

EXPERIENCED DRIVERS.

That this is true can easily be seen by anyone who has tried the simple method of a fairly experienced driver to get into his car for the first time. If the position of the driver is not correct, it is evident at once that he is really uncomfortable. Then he gets used to the vehicle, and the steering wheel is held firmly, and every drive is not nearly so difficult.

COMFORTABLE POSITION.

If every motorist realized the vital importance of a comfortable position, there would be far fewer poor drivers on our roads to-day.

and the problem of getting into the car and the problem of getting out of the car are not solved.

The lower-position cars are in most cases more comfortable than those of a medium height, but on some expensive vehicles there is no real advantage in having the driver's seat low, and it should not be practised. For example, in the case of a small car, such as the Austin Seven, the low position is not so good as the high one, because the driver's legs should not be strained when the car is moving.

The only controls which should be difficult to make use of are the clutch and the accelerator, and these should be well within reach of the driver's hands.




