





EDUCATION POLICY IN UGANDA Outlined on Speech Day at the Makerere College.

HIS EXCELLENCY'S MESSAGE.

A series of Discourses prepared for students, High Moral Standard and Institute of Experimental were outlined during Speech Day at Makerere College, Uganda, at the essential features of the new Education Policy.

Reference was made to disquieting rumours that the Regents are casting doubt on the usefulness of the Institution.

Speech Day, Distribution of prizes, and the visit of the Governor which took place at the Uganda Museum in Kampala Uganda were held on Saturday evening.

The Governor was unavoidably absent from the ceremony, his message which was read by the Inspector, Mr. Jarvis, Chief Secretary for Uganda.
