



The presence of rats is a serious menace to the health of a community and it is therefore of the utmost importance that their numbers should be reduced to an absolute minimum.

The rat disease most easily conveyed by rats by far the most important in this Colony is Plague. This is essentially a rat disease, more especially Epidemic Jaundice, Sodoku or Rat Pest.

The financial loss occasioned by rats is also of great economic importance. By burrowing under foundations, through walls, pipes and waste and by gnawing away the insulation of electric cables they have been known to cause destructive outbreaks of fire. Heavy kind of foodstuffs which are stored in granaries are often severely damaged by rats.
