

E.A. London Section Appeals to Shipowners.

WILL THEY CUT A QUARTER?

[From Our Own Correspondent.]

London, Jan. 3.—An agency meeting of the East Africa Cotton Association and Chamber of Commerce has decided unanimously to appeal to shipowners to reduce the freight rates and reduced by 25 per cent in order to meet the increased cost in railway rates. All were agreed that the reduction was of the outmost importance.

Sir H. H. Simpson, Legation agent for East Africa, in order to ensure a minimum price of ten shillings per cwt. per ton, said that his Directorate had agreed to pay a minimum of 10/- per cwt. in 1927.

There is great doubt whether the shipowners would accept so readily what they were preparing for a 10/- per cwt. reduction, which they eventually abandoned.

COMING CONFERENCE ON STOCK INDUSTRY.

New Departure By Government.

A memorandum of conditions has been drawn up at Nairobi by the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, and the Department of Agriculture (the then Home Office), to convene a Conference of all the associations with the following object: the finalizing of the making of the Convention of Arusha.

With a view to the formation of an Annual Conference of the stockmen of East Africa, the Home Office has issued a circular to the annual Main Conference, the Ministry of Agriculture, Director of Agriculture, to convene a Meeting of all the stock farmers who are members.
