## THE SCREEN WIPER.

### How It Should be Adjusted Properly.

#### ENSURING CLEAR VISION.

An automatic screen wiper, like a new broom, should sweep clean, but if it sweeps too hard, or if it sweeps a wiper should, if anything gets broken, whereas old brooms are easily repaired, so are the wipers. The Light Car and Cycle Car, etc., are the best.


