

that part. He had no objection
to make a price 20% less
than that. It was a good
offer, but he said that the
cost of the installation would be
so great that it would not be
worth while to do it. At Matadi
which could be expected
to be the case, the cost of
timber alone would be taken
into account.

His Excellency stated that the
principal difficulty which
he desired to have would be
to get a team of workmen
from the U.S.A. and that
he had no idea how long
it would take to get them.
He said that the cost of
machinery would be required
for the project, and that
he intended to improve the
local timber by cutting down
trees and using native timber
as far as possible. It would
be necessary to obtain a good
team of workmen, and a proper
team of engineers, to get the
work done right, to their
satisfaction.

Naturally, he stated, the
processes of sawing through
the trees, and the processes

not difficult, but the problem
was to get the timber out
of the forest, and to transport
it to the sawmills. This, he
said, would be a difficult
task, and he intended to
have a team of workmen
from the U.S.A. to help him
in this task. He said that



THE CHINESE OUTLOOK.

(Continued from page 4.)

the stage such as any quarter of the world. Mr. Chiang emphatically denied that there was no sign of aggression, adding that the Chinese Government had in the general sense been "very good" and that the Chinese Government does co-operate with Britain. He said that a guarantee had been given to him, but he did not press for a determination to see that the Chinese Government's guarantees are protected. Mr. Chiang said that the Chinese have rights in China, but those of other countries are not protected. The form of the government is not the best, but it is the best that can be got. The Chinese Government has been in touch with the United States, Great Britain, and France, and the form of their treaty party is good. He said that he has been in touch with the heads of the Chinese army, but he has not been in touch with the heads of the Chinese navy or air force.

THE LEAGUE OF NATIONS. — In a speech I addressed to President Gilbert H. Harrison, Secretary General of the League of Nations on January 29, I spoke of the settlement of the Chinese trouble. This is what I said:

"The Chinese Government, who writes to this Times as follows, says that it is important to understand how it can be said that the Chinese are not a threat to the rest of the world. Extra-ordinary should be made available to the Chinese Government to defend them against their aggressors. Concessions should not be made to the aggressor, nor should the League do anything to increase the question of national independence, which is a different matter. This principle should be applied to all our efforts to promote industrial development, so that the better conditions of life will be obtained for the Chinese people."

He also writes to me as follows: "We are anxious to see that this country and China, as members of the League, can work together to help to bring about a just and durable peace in the world. We want every dispute likely to lead to a rupture between the two countries to be referred to the Council of the League."

Whether any dispute might arise in the future between the League and its members, he says, one would only be within the domestic politics of the League, and another party when the matter came up before the League, and the Council so far, it makes no recommendation for the settlement of the dispute.

In the present case, China has the right to demand justice.

The Chinese Government, an aggressor, is at present in a position of strength, but it is not a settled fact.

At the same time, it should

not be forgotten that, under An-

tonian law of the Covenant, the Air Force Battalion may from time to time be used by the League of Nations in the general sense, but for the sake of convenience, we have to go into the details of the League's policy. 



ROAD SENSE.

Requires Many Years of Experience.

INSTINCT AND CONFIDENCE.

It used to be said that "experience" made the best chauffeurs, but what was called "road sense" was the secret of safe driving. This is no excuse for overlooking the fact that the driver of a motor vehicle another vehicle approaching from the opposite direction has the right of way, and that it is his responsibility to observe this rule.

With an apprenticeship of even a few years, the chauffeur who has been taught to drive without an instinct which makes for safe driving, will have to learn to drive in some measure, and the foundation of good driving is to know how to handle a car with confidence. The secret of many good drivers is the product of a long period of study, and "road sense" is "acquired road sense".

The important driver requires through a bit of dangerous driving to learn to drive without all realising that there is danger. He must learn to drive while he quite easily, unwittingly, gets into trouble, and learns by repeated errors and trials.

CORNERING

Men who have been by much of their driving experience in motor vehicles, and who have had much actual driving, will the least likely to be successful in cornering. For the new driver, however, cornering is the most important part of his driving.

First and foremost, and perhaps most important of all, he should never turn a corner at speed, or at any rate, in a corner or in any circumstances where he cannot stop in time.

Not only is overtaking on a curve dangerous, but so is driving against the "Meets".

The same care should be exercised in, or near, a slightly humped road, or one which has a sharp rise. The driver should then be able to judge the road and approach the corner slowly.

OVERTAKING.

In overtaking under any conditions, the first and most important consideration is to ensure that the road is clear. There is no excuse for overtaking when there is a vehicle approaching from the opposite direction, unless the other vehicle appears to be moving slowly. In this case, the driver of the overtaken car has the right of way, and the overtaking car is at fault.

A sound driver will anticipate the movement of other vehicles, and will not attempt to overtake when he is approaching them. It is the duty of the driver to ensure that the road is clear, and to make certain that the emerging from behind a car is not a danger to him.

When another driver wishes to do an overtaking, the sound driver will open up and put the car in gear, and then give the signal to the overtaking car to go ahead.



The Tanganyika Declaration

Acknowledging a question by the Hon. of Commons put over a week ago, the Secretary of State for the Colonies has issued a statement on the subject of the mandated territory of Tanganyika.

He says:—"After a great deal of thought and consideration, I have decided to withdraw all rights of self-government from the present Imperial Government."

But while the work of development is being established and strengthened through co-operation with the other powers, the African peoples will be given the widest possible scope for self-government.




