SUPERCHARGING

The Forced Induction System.

INCREASE IN POPULARITY.

Neat to the front-wheel break, the development of what may be termed the forced induction system has been of more interest than any other during the past few years. The reason lies in the fact that this system has achieved an unusual position in the world racing car field, and it is now regarded as being made for actual production models. The question may arise whether that device will ever be more widely used on cars. 



THE HOME HOSPITAL

Mothers are often harassed by the care of their children. The housewife, midwife and first-aid chief, should be a good nurse.

Slight burns frequently cause blisters. These should be covered with a small piece of oil cloth, the burn being afterwards covered with clean, soft rags, and treated by a doctor if it is at all bad. This is the best way to treat a burn.

Severe burns, or sudden or hot ones, should be treated with cold water to subdue the heat.

It is well to keep a small amount of oil cloth in the pocket. Wrap it first in a towel, then in a clean cloth, and then in a clean sheet.

STALK-BORER INFESTATION.

A Farmer's Solution.

The enormous annual loss sustained by our maize-farmers, causes the stalk-bee to be a very serious pest. As far as we can see at present, no effective remedy—so to speak—is available to combat this pest. An efficient and economical solution has eventually been found by one of our farmers.

Mr. T. D. Hoover of Mombasa, British East Africa, has during the past maize-season applied, under Government supervision, his own feasible solution in practice. The result has been so startlingly good that we now have reason to believe that you can serve your fields without costly overhauling.

He method has thirty stages:

(1) The "Stalk Heaver."

During the winter the leaves in the pupa stage infest the part of the stalk above ground. It has thus in the past been the practice of many farmers to plough the land in winter, after the stalks have been cut, in an attempt to bring all stalks above-ground, so that the pupa may be exterminated by the soil.

This method, however, is not, nor is it practical, because (1) It places a double strain upon the once-prized maize crop; (2) Leaves that go into the ground are actually brought above-ground which leaves a corresponding amount of space behind; (3) It is thus a expense and a waste of time and money. Experiments have proved that 15 per cent of these maize plants will survive even though brought above-ground as they are not infested by the cold.

The stalk-heaver is dragged along the ground, the stalks being drawn forward and then broken, as those stalks, which are only partially infested, are usually broken in one direction, so that the stalks remain in the open direction.

It is however possible that a few stalks will remain intact, but this is a small task for men to do over the land and extract these.

No efficiency can be obtained if the three stages are applied separately, but when application becomes continuous, the first two stages will result in application to the first season.

THE WOOLPACK PROBLEM.

There is a continued deterioration on the part of those who have taken a hand in the campaign to bring about improvement, which is the only way to get a better quality.

The quality of the raw material is not good, and there are no local tests of any particular fabric.

The Textile Association of the Colony pack makers are doing their best to improve the quality of the fabric, but an all-round pack would be the most effective remedy.

So far the recent article in "The Standard" on "All Wool" pack seems to have done its work and the textile association of manufacturers of fine woolen fabrics has been formed to combat which constantly appear and have to be picked out by hand.

There is a certain amount of interest in the improvement of the quality of the woolen uniforms.

The possibility of a solution can only be obtained by investigating, for more information, into the all-round pack, but the Textile Association has a full way of practical tests and the examination of relative costs before coming to a conclusion as to whether or not the newer processes will be more expensive than the old.
