**EAST AFRICAN LAW.**

In common with other men who hold a sort of public passion we have been for the past twelve months subjected to a continuous libelling in a sheet calling itself the Uganda Mail. In my last we were not only accused of filthy and obscene writing, but our then employers were plainly asked to dispend with our services. We issued summons for criminal libel, and the case has been allowed

to drag along until December. From the outset the two accused have flagrantly flouted the Court—the male accused by openly refusing to attend the hearings (the charge is *criminal libel*), and the female by hysterically commenting on the case, while it was *sub judice*, and by publishing another screed which it is not too much to say the worst woman who walks Pictadilly would be ashamed to put her name to.

The case is closed. The Magistrate holds that the matter complained of was defamatory and libellous, it was not true, and not published for the public benefit, and he fines the accused Rs. 35 each.

These are the facts. Surely comment would be superfluous.

Our Entebbe correspondent informs us that the Magistrate has been promoted to Uganda—the land of the Sleeping Sickness.

We congratulate the Magistrate.

**OUR TRADE.**

The value of trade imports in November was Rs. 4,29,584, the decrease in value being Rs. 1,31,552.

Of the different articles imported, piece goods, cotton, amounted to R. 76,172; provisions R. 27,197, building materials R. 21,553; grain and flour R. 14,680 (not a penny's worth should be necessary to be imported); hardware, glassware &c., R. 10,610.

Of the amount expended in this country on imports the United Kingdom received R19,573, Germany R. 8,885, and Holland R. 20,851. India and Burma got R. 88,003, and the African and Arabian Ports, R. 17,484.

Of the articles exported hides, horns, &c., amounted to R4,392, potatoes R. 30,445, ivory R. 28,188, ground nuts, R. 70,703, and Rubber R. 2,897.

The total value of exports in November was R120,780, showing an increase on the same month of last year of R16,900.

**SLEEPING SICKNESS IN UGANDA.**

**NO EUROPEAN CASES.**

During the week some alarming rumours as to the spread of sleeping sickness in Uganda were current. It was stated that three Europeans had been attacked, and that the disease was spreading amongst Europeans generally. Apparently the facts were much exaggerated. We telegraphed to our Entebbe correspondent, and this is the reply.

Entebbe, Dec. 17.—Sleeping sickness amongst Europeans has been locally suspected for many months.

Mr. Mahon and Mr. Trave left here with tripanosoma in their blood, but both are enjoying perfect health in Europe, the local habitation of both.

The vicinity of the forest is especially susceptible to infection.

These are the only two authenticated cases.

The recent rumours are false and baseless.
