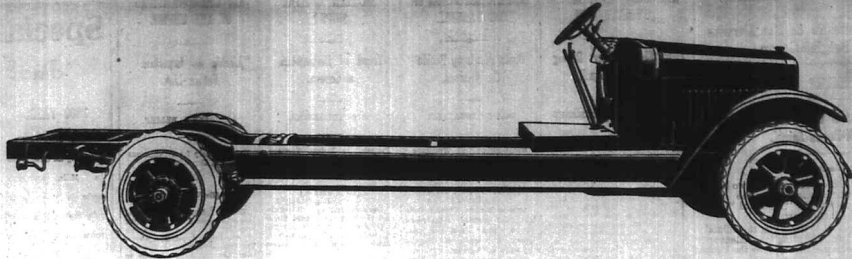

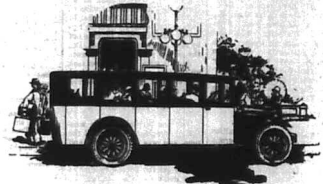

EXPLOITING KENYA'S FORESTS.

44 per cent. Increase in Quantity Sold from Forest Reserves.

CEADR INDUSTRY DISAPPOINTMENT.

Exports of Timber Rise by One-third in Twelve Months.

The exploitation of the forests of Kenya by the timber industry and the fuel needs of the Colony are examined in the second extract from the Forestry Department Report which appears below.

The amount of timber sold from the forest reserves increased by 44 per cent. over the previous highest figure of 1920.

Before there is a reliable estimate of the stock of mature timber in the forests of the Colony it will be impossible accurately to state the position of the country.

During the year the Colony exported timber valued at £22,546 and imported timber valued at £29,924 of which nearly half was for Government use. The importation of timber has gone up over 23 per cent. of the year.

The cedar trade did not make satisfactory progress during the year. It is suggested for consideration the importance of placing a restriction before local needs in timber. British manufacturers have shown little interest in Kenya cedar.

The Fuel Problem.

Further statistics are made for the year 1924 from the Forest Department. The first part of the report deals with the fuel needs of the Colony.

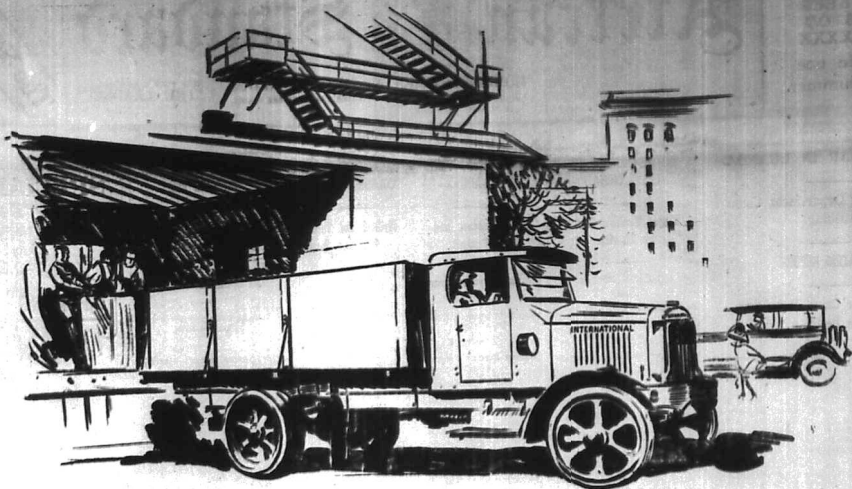

CONSERVING FOREST WEALTH.
Principles Which Underlie the Actions of the Department.

MONEY TRANSFERRED TO NATIVE COLONY.

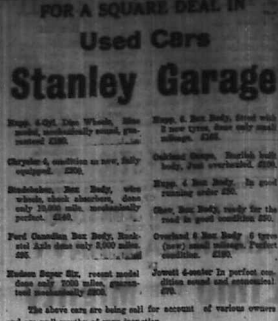

KENNEL NOTES

Margaret Collyer

Miss Collyer: Ought to whom all correspondence in connection with "Kennel Notes" should be addressed, does not hold herself responsible for information obtained by her correspondents.

With regard to Mr. Bell's dog who was caught by a leopard some time ago and who is still suffering some months since, which his owners think may be caused by still some poison left in his blood, I give two instances of my own experience of poison wounds, and what happened. One was a bitch who in a faint with a wart had a bad wound from a lark in her groin. For weeks I treated this wound, syringing it out constantly and giving her mild doses of salts to help circulation in the poison in her, the syringing got better for a while, but still the wound would never heal, there was nearly always a running yellow discharge. At the end of about two months she showed signs of paralysis in her hind legs, and eventually because I failed to prescribe bandage I became totally paralysed though I gave her every chance to recover, she had to be put down. A similar case in a big pointer named I had, got caught by the horn of a wounded kangaroo in the ribs. His bones were broken as far as I could feel, but there was a nasty deep hole in his side. The same thing occurred. The wound would not heal, and he also after a very long time became paralysed though he had the best of medical treatment both at home and in the hospital as well as in the country, he apparently was suffering no pain.

I do not know how this can be accounted for excepting that in some mysterious way the poison caused the inability to use the blood lines. I was not very surprised in the case of the bitch, for she was hurt in the groin, and the blood might have caused some injury to the spine. But this could not have been in the dog, for the hole was just behind the shoulder and midway between his shoulder and his hind (or girls).

Of course it is just possible that I had a chance of getting those

It should be recognized, i.e. when the dog shows signs of nose, loss of appetite and release of pus from the nostrils, the treatment should be given in a tablespoonful of milk given each morning for seven or four days. After four days interval give one tablet a night for another four days. After such a course Dr. Day assures me I have had no relapses. An Absolute dog of such a size would cost two to three shillings a day for

the first two days but after the four days interval only one tablet every night for the other four days. Doctor Day says that all the dogs have rapidly recovered their appetites after the first two days and have taken well and increased most greatly. The last has been so ill effects from the drug, and he has never found it necessary to give any more. The fact of his finding dogs recovered within the last stages of the disease, almost immediately in fact. In again writing of Shetland, I have in a column about repeated myself, but I have had one or two letters from people about it who had not taken sufficient interest in the dog. The content of my notes on the dog will I should advise others who are interested in the matter, to take steps to buy a copy of the book "Kennel Notes" which is so to be when necessary. 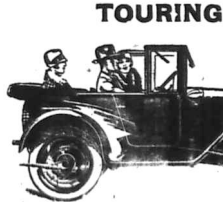
