'RAILWAY ROLLING STOCK.

Legislative Council Approves Borrowings Amounting to £231,520.

MR. FELLING REPLIES TO CRITIC.

Elected Members Recommended to Study His "Delightful Literature."

The General Manager of Railways took part in an unexpectedly breezy discussion on railway finance in the Legislative Council yesterday.

The subject matter was a motion approving the borrowing of £231,520 in advance of local expenditures to provide more rolling stock.

Criticism was chiefly directed to the wisdom or otherwise of using loan funds for such additions to railway equipment and the General Manager appeared to fretted Members to get the facts before they began to criticise.

THE MAIZE AND COTTON SEASON.

In the Legislative Council yesterday the General Manager of Railways initiated a somewhat important debate on the finance and policy to be followed.

When by Resolution dated 9th November 1926, this Council authorised the Government to undertake negotiations for obtaining an approved loan fund in pursuance of a request from the Railway Administration.

And whereas it has become necessary to their loan expenditure on the Railway Locomotives and Rolling Stock to the extent of £1,732,720 and the Secretary of State has intimated that the Government will advance the necessary funds.

The latter incident was undoubtedly a blow to the community here, who were looking to see a full blown air-mail service in operation very shortly. Everyone is greatly sorry about the affair, and when Mr. Blackburn, a director of the Kenya Tea and Coffee Co., arrived in Kisumu two days after the accident, he could not but have been struck by the incident properly and offers of help displayed. I believe Mr. Blackburn is of the opinion that a large powered engine would be more suitable for the conditions existing out here.

Chatting to Capt. Glushko after the excitement had died down I gathered that the opinion held by the organizers of the scheme was that the link Kisumu-Kisumu in the air mail line on the Cape was bound to come and by hydroplane, and he estimated that in two years probably it would be going strong.

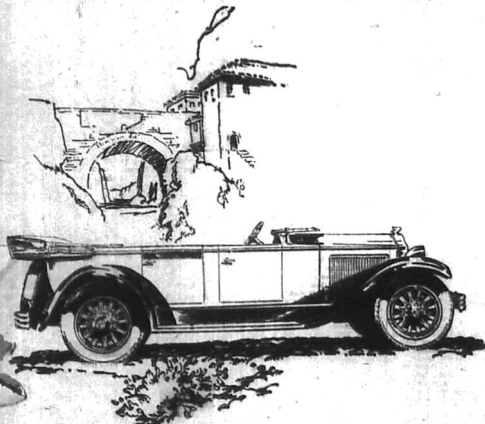

THE DODGE CYCLE

New Models for Coming Year.

CHIEF CHARACTERISTICS

Perhaps the most surprising feature of the new women's programme is the basic improvement of the design of the new "E.V." It does not by any means follow the actual design of this well-known but before it is very much modified, but the makers are in favour of a straightforward technical description, followed by "E.V." indicating the year of manufacture.

The following is a short summary of the chief characteristics of the eight models:

Model A/20-240 c.c. side valve, with the new black, black finish, and entirely impracticable designed to make well under 200 lb. limit. Price £125.

Model B/20-240 c.c. side valve, with rear chain, carrier, and the other new features. An export or overseas edition also available for the home market. Price £145.

to the former "E.V." of the same capacity, but with the new frame and fuel tank, and new motor components. Price £125.

Model F/20-240 c.c. side valve; a sports edition of the previous model, with new black finish, new grips, new handlebars, and other new details. Price £145.

Model G/20-240 c.c. s.v. standard; this is practically the same as the "E.V." model, with many improvements, including the new frame. Price £125.

Model H/20-240 c.c. s.v.; this is a sports edition of the previous model, with aluminium pistons, dropped handlebars, and other new details. Price £145.

In addition to this general range of eight models, the special 100 lb. racing machines will continue to be made in order in 1934, and 500 c.c. size, the price being about £200.

There are several new features of which are common to all the models, notably, the construction of the frame and handle tubes; the possibility of motor mounting has been removed by building equal length spacers to an equal length tube, and by mounting the handle spring plate of the spacers on a spring plate.

The front forks are now similar to the rear ones, and in some instances, on the same principle; this is very effective in the use of the new front plates in the front fork, a view to meeting the strains of sidecar work.

The reduced under-lugs are fitted to some of the models are quite novel, in that they take the form of screwing to fill up the space between footboards and crank axle; they are designed to prevent water and city dirt collecting.

Improvements to the Clutch

A small, but good, alteration is that the outer clutch plate is

The Douglas tread-type clutch control is a standard fitting on all sports models, as is a new shape of dropped handlebar, which allows a very natural position for the arms and wrists. The petrol tanks are unchanged, but a small extra amount of large radius the saddle height by about 2 in. on the smaller models, but otherwise the general build has not been varied.

The engine of the new "D/20" model has been entirely redesigned, with the possible exception of the crank case and timing gear, which are unchanged. On one of the models certain accessories such as the exhaust system, footrest hangers, gear roll, and steering damper, are details still in the process of development, but the general lines of a very attractive model are there. It is to be marketed in a sporting standard, but of course, delivery cannot be guaranteed as soon as the other models; it is probably, delivery should begin early in the new year. A remark, also that the s.v. model has a wheelbase 2 in. shorter than the standard side-valve models.

Of the 200 c.c. models the modification is that they are brought into line with the other machines on the points of built and brake drum connection, black finish, etc.

For Owners

Regarding the "D/20" model, the suitability for the overseas market is derived from better choice, greater chain plates (to be used), a point derived from motor cycle football experience, and a stronger carrier, together with heavier gear spines, and strengthened rear stays; all standard ground clearance has, in stated, proved quite sufficient.

The 200 c.c. engine is very suitable for the mounting of a separate drive for a lighting generator, and the Douglas engine, which is based on an extra, is very neatly arranged.—Motor Cycle.

Comprehensive Official Statement of 1923 Financial Intentions.

NO NEW TAXATION.

Secretary Reorganisation to Revitalize Ministry of Land Department.

The Colonial Secretary provided a very comprehensive summary of the Budget proposals in a speech before the Legislative Council yesterday.

He said that revenue had been conservatively estimated and Government expected in the absence of any unwarmed event that it would be exceeded.

The new Secretary's reorganization scheme abolishes the Land Office and brings into being Local Government and Land Settlement branches as separate executive organizations.

Considerable provision is made for extension of native services, including new hospitals, training of African workers in domestic science, a school clinic for Indian and African children, school buildings, extended veterinary services, improvement of native sheep, reforestation and agriculture.

No new taxes are included in the Budget but the Education Tax will remain as no alternative has been put before Government.

In regard to Civil Service conditions it is proposed that second class travelling privileges only be granted to those drawing £500 per annum and under and that fourth allowances should cease. Form of rest houses at the Coast for Civil Servants.

The grant of passage concessions to wives and families of Asian Civil Servants is also suggested. The post of Deputy Chief Native Commissioner is abolished.

A grant-in-aid is included for Indian and African child welfare centres.

Saving has been effected by the reorganisation of the K.A.R. transport service.

Introduction of an inland penny post is forecasted for 1923. A telegraph line to be laid from Mombasa to the Tanganyika border to join with the Tanganyika line to Dar-es-Salaam.

A survey has been made for the purpose of a geological survey in conjunction with Uganda.

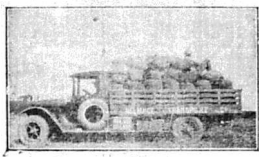

Chemistry.

The chemical conditions existing in the soil of the Colonies are indicated in the memorandum prepared by Sir John Russell regarding the proposed soil survey of Africa. It is recognized that in Kenya almost every different method of soil analysis is practised, and that there are a number of different systems employed in the characterization of soils.

Similar conditions of ignorance exist in the other branches of science associated with plant nutrition. These conditions can only be removed because the workers in this domain have not been able to keep in touch with the advances made. In order to enable these operators to maintain themselves up to date, a clearinghouse of information is required. Thus, the International Society of Soil Scientists has recently been able to issue abstracts of papers relating to soil science. The soil scientists in the younger colonies are in need of such data. They have to work in a wider field than pure soil science and are in need of wider information on all aspects of soil nutrition on which their production depends.

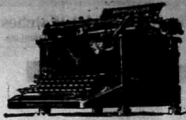

They most kindly offer to let me have "Maidie Beld" and the most faithful and a welcome here where the most one year of his life. Mrs. Wake however, writes—"We very much appreciate your example to dog nursing to use their own in the Standard of last week both "Black Bats" and "Maidie Beld" can find and follow a scent, nose down; all least from "Bald" of course, who learned to nose up, from the Airedale."

It is very sad that this good friend of Greyhound must needs be broken up. Also it is a great wrench to have to part with one pet. No one knows it better than I do.

I send my best thanks to Dr. Hurkitt for sending me a "Translation of the Royal Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene." This particular volume is all on the subject of the bite of venomous snakes in India, and the experiments that have been made to secure an antidote for both the poison of Cobaltinum and Viper. This is not connected with the little book I have read and been full of Viper venom's treatment. Take ligatures for instance. I find a paragraph which I will quote—"The usefulness of ligatures in poisoning from Cobaltinum snakes is strictly limited. The effect of ligatures after Cobra bite is merely to prolong the interval to death. This indicated venom is temporarily locked up within the ligatured limb. As soon as the ligature is removed, the imprisoned venom floods the circulation and kills the patient."

this most of us have known before. The treatment of a snake bite is as follows—(1) Instantly apply a firm ligature. It should be applied at such a spot that it will compress all the tissue beyond the single bone, and prevent leakage of venom into the circulation; (2) If possible lift and identify the snake. If one of the "Maidie Beld" types of India, a dose of iodine solution will do the trick. If the snake is recovered, and the patient watched. (3) If one of the six lethal snakes, further measures are necessary. (4) If certain that the snake was a lethal one, immediate amputation may be recommended for bite on finger or toe; (5) If the bite be elsewhere, or if it is only supposed that the snake was a lethal one, or if the case be very more than 15 minutes after the bite, dissolve a photographic's 15-grain tube of gold chloride in a minimum of water. Fill a strong hypodermic syringe with it and attempt to isolate and totally destroy the whole dose of venom injected. No suction should be made.

The most interesting booklet was published in June, 1911, and it is probable that masters have been held over them and many more experiments made. The worst snake-bite to date is a really happy when one is far from home, and remember that you may possess very poisonous crystals in your pockets. I now merely use their own—unless it were to hypodermic, only inject the solution of them. I must find out if such a thing could be done.

The anti-venom made by Fitz-Simmons is declared to be a new one for all African snakes, even if injected some time after the bite. One that it retains its strength for at least two years. The antidote used in India apparently needs to be fresh. Many of our best dogs are killed by snake bite and it is up to us to try and find a remedy that can
