The bill passed through the Senate exempting coasting steamers from the Act and also containing an amendment enabling foreign vessels to obtain American registry and thus secure the freedom of the canal and another amendment excluding ships owned by railroads.

Natural History Society's Journal.

B. E. A. THOU.

The July, 1912, number of the Journal of the East Africa and Uganda Natural History Society will be particularly interesting reading. It contains an article of special interest relating to "Fish Culture in B.E.A." In this connection a very admirably executed illustration is given of a trout, caught in the Aberdare, with a length of 24 inches and weighing 61 pounds. An attempt has been made to place trout from the Aberdare streams in the Moresnet river which feeds Lake Naivasha. This has been accomplished by turning in twenty-nine trout of the average size of nine inches into the Moresnet. Besides this transference thirty fish were taken from the Chania river. Mr. D. E. Hutkins the writer of the article relates his experience in the introduction of carp to the dam at the house of the Chief C. E. of the Forests, Nairobi, during the latter end of the year 1910. These are said to be flourishing.

Another interesting article gives details of a small fish of about three inches long which is found in the strongly impregnated waters of Lake Margat. The writer, Mr. C. W. Woodhouse, believes the original occurrence of these fish which could not have been water borne was due to the introduction of oars adhering to the lills of some of the boats which frequent the lake.

Two new found animals are given a place in this number of the Journal. One is a description of the water-phylax to Mr. H. J. Cunningham from details supplied by M. Le Pott who came across this weird creature in the Congo.

A still more weird freak, close to our own shores is what purports to be a new orem and described by Mr. Geoffrey Williams on the Uasin Gishu. From the evidence which the writer gives it seems to be no doubt that some peculiar animal inhabits those regions even though it may be only a lipoidal hyena.

Notes on some of the principal biting flies in B.E.A. by S. A. Neave, the expert entomologist who recently made an extended search in East Africa, give full details of the blood-sucking flies, the majority of which belong to the family Tabanidae. Of the minority the (Olesoma and Stomoxys) belong to the Muscidae.

While on the subject of flies we may perhaps refer here to an article called "The 'Pill' of October 7, 1911, which is a report to the Executive Committee of the Natal and Zululand Game Protection Association of the sub-committee appointed to inquire into the life history of Olesoma morsitans and Olesoma pallipes and their relation to game animals." Briefly stated the sub-committee are responsible for the transmission of the sleeping sickness virus, as these flies, which are the sleeping virus carriers, may exist where there is no big game, therefore it would be a mistake to kill off big game even although these may be carriers of the trypanosome. The report is notable mainly for its criticism on unsuitably trained people who have misconceptions on the inter-relation of the tsetse trypanosome and game, while it should creep up when we look back upon the speculative measures which the Government had adopted with regard to the dispersal of Crown Town Land.

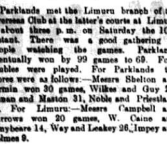

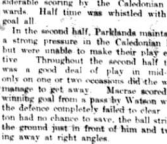

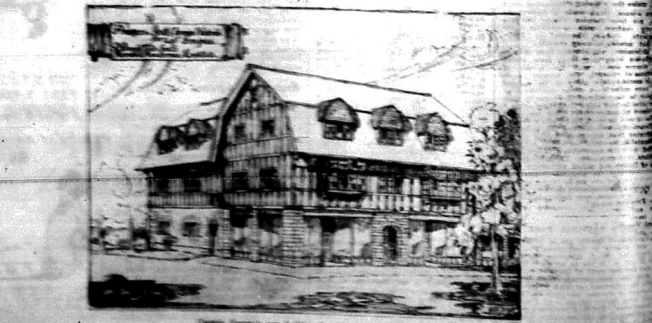
