COIL IGNITION.

Simple Explanation of Its Principles.

NOT WELL UNDERSTOOD.

The term "coil ignition" is not often used, but it is often mentioned, because it is a very simple method of generating current for the ignition of the engine. It is a coil of wire wound around an iron core which has a small air gap. The voltage induced in the coil is proportional to the rate of change of the current flowing through the primary coil, so that if there is a large current in the primary coil, there will be a high voltage across the secondary coil.

MR. CARBERRY'S FLIGHT
(Incorporated from page 1.)

It is obvious of course that among such people anyone compelled to take a flight would have had great difficulty in convincing the Redskins that he was not one of them. Pilot after pilot who have had this unfortunate experience have been captured by the treacherous savage desert tribes. The Italian Air Force have seen many flights in the course of their operations in the desert. There are several points engaged in carrying on a continuous flight, flying perhaps a hundred miles into the interior for the purpose of reconnoitring, and are often very unsettled state with the exception of a few hours' sleep.

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MOTOR TOPICS

CAR SPECIFICATIONS.

Terms Which Are Often Misunderstood.

SIMPLE EXPLANATIONS

Descriptions of classes should in the advertising journals and in the literature issued by the manufacturers, but these never contain technical terms which are often used, failing to those new to motorizing who have very little knowledge of the mechanical details. The following technical reads that the descriptions of the cars in the picture will appear to be to go through an ordinary book of terms.

The first term which comes up is "Displacement." This is the volume of air contained in the cylinders when the piston is at the bottom of the stroke.

It is often given as "cubic inches," but in addition may be given as "litres" or "c.c." The first two are common, but the last is the most exact. For example, in the case of a 120-h.p. motor, the displacement would be 175 c.c.

Following to the displacement comes the "horse-power." This is the power output of the engine, measured at the flywheel, and is equal to the external dimensions of the engine, multiplied by the number of cylinders, and then divided by the number of strokes per minute.

The next term is "torque," which is a measure of the driving force at the flywheel, and is equal to the diameter of the flywheel times the number of revolutions per minute.

The reports of an engine's "power" make no reference to its power output, but rather to the "torque" swept through by one rotation, making a stroke multiplied by the number of cylinders.

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It is usually stated in cubic centimetres (c.c.), there being one thousand cubic mm. in one c.c. The maximum speed of the engine of the touring class being 21 h.p. per 100 c.c. or 100 h.p. per 4,765 c.c., with a capacity of 2,000 c.c. may be expected to develop 45 h.p. when the engine is running at 3,000 r.p.m. in this being 1,000 c.c. and the engine having a bore of 75 mm. It will have a capacity of 3,000 c.c. and

it may call it so, is exactly the same as a car rated as 5 to 6 with 100 h.p. in a 100 c.c. engine, with a ratio of 45 to 1 and 27 in. tyne, the change of gear being 3.5 to 1, the engine will be balanced by the alteration in wheel size.

Top-gear Ratio

The top-gear ratio is determined by the statement that the gear ratio is 10 to 1 when there is no alteration in revolution when the engine is running at 3,000 r.p.m. The top-gear ratio however is often given as 10 to 1, the engine being 10 to 1 in this manner, that the reduction is so great as to give a ratio of 1 to 1 in second.

For this reason manufacturers give the top-gear ratio as 10 to 1, the engine being 10 to 1 in this manner, the top-gear ratio is 10 to 1.

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

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

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
