WORLD'S NEWS. BY CABLE.

King's Reported Visit to Rhodesia.

WILL HE CALL AT R. E. A?

Claver's Special to "E. A. Standard," London, Sept. 21. The "Pall Mall Gazette" reports that it is believed the King has probably arranged an invitation to South Africa in 1914. The trip is expected to include Rhodesia where there will probably be a special commission worthy of a royal visit in connection with a change in the status of that territory.

The King's Secretary, interviewed by Hector, states that "His Majesty has not received an invitation."

Home Manoeuvres.

Sudden Termination.

DECISIVE BATTLE IMPOSSIBLE.

London, Sept. 19. The manoeuvres in East Anglia have suddenly terminated. The disposition after a day of scattered fighting was such that a decisive battle was impossible. In the absence of an official statement the papers describe the situation to be due to the efficiency of the aeroplane which nullified the tactical movements of the troops.

CONFERENCE ON RESULTS.

London, September 19. The King made a final tour of the bivouacs at the manoeuvres in the morning, returning in time to be present at the conference held by General French and the other Generals at Trinity College where the results of the manoeuvres were discussed.

London, September 20. At the conclusion of the manoeuvres the King inspected the troops and expressed his conviction that the training had been conducted on the soundest lines. His Majesty's Commissioner attended a conference of officers at which the plans of the opposing Generals were criticised.

VALUABLE SCOUTING.

London, September 20. The officers at the manoeuvres ridiculed the suggestions that the aeroplanes caused alarm.

An interesting point elicited at the conference of the generals was the admission of General Sir Douglas Haig, commanding the invaders, that the invader aeroplanes were unable to locate the whole division of twelve thousand men and horses whose march (General Sir James Grierson, commanding the defenders), starting in the darkness, was concealed by hugging the hedgerows and woods, when the sound of an aeroplane was heard the team sought cover. Nevertheless the new scouting force is most valuable owing to the extent of ground covered by the speed, and also the accuracy of the aeroplane. The reports brought in by the Territorial cyclists and motor cyclists were also most useful.

ATRI-SHIP'S SPLENDID WORK.

London, September 19. The ship's gunnery was cut the whole night yesterday and correctly located every vessel of both armies engaged in the manoeuvres. The ship's dropped several times including bombs—also two over Cambridge. The night was moonless almost starless. The gunnery work was invisible, her engines alone vaguely indicating her whereabouts. In the morning she proceeded down to Alverstoke. The station officers are highly delighted at the feats she performed.

London, Sept. 21. The ship's gunnery returned to Farnborough from the manoeuvres. She sighted a torpedo owing to a storm which had cooled with a gale. The sea was rough and the officers aboard had narrow escapes.

Sazonoff Arrives. INCIDENT AT WILMOUR.

London, September 21. The Russian Foreign Secretary M. Sazonoff arrived at Victoria Station to-day and was received by ambassador and Sir Edward Grey. At the moment of his arrival a man rushed to the carriage uttering a phlegm shouting "Clear out of Paris. Down with Russia!" He was seized by detectives.

Squadron at Copenhagen. GERMAN'S TRAGIC WARNING.

London, Sept. 20. The British naval squadron after its visit to Norway visited Copenhagen, Denmark, where the members of the fleet were much feted. A sensation was caused during the visit by the arrival of the German airship Hansa, commanded by Count Zeppelin, from Hamburg. The airship was seen over the squadron, at the request of the Danish authorities, but landed for half an hour and then returned to Hamburg.

In Morocco. FRENCH ATTACKED.

Paris, Sept. 19. A French column which was attacked midway between Oujda and Fez, lost 10 killed and had thirty wounded. The attack was repulsed.

Buda Pest Riots.

London, Sept. 19. There was some rioting in the streets of Buda Pest yesterday evening in consequence of the Russians attempting to hold universal suffrage demonstrations which the authorities prohibited. The troops and police broke up the meetings. It is officially admitted that many have been injured. Twenty-four people were seriously injured and eighty have been arrested.

Tariff Reform Mandate.

London, Sept. 19. Mr. E. R. Smith speaking at Dullington said that the British would not return to power without a definite mandate for Tariff Reform.

Lots for Harikari.

YAPANESE WARRIORS. Fifty Japanese at Grand Junction, Colorado, held a secret meeting to draw lots to which one of them is to commit Harikari over the death of the Mikado. The police managed to get in the meeting in time and broke it up, straitening the leader.

Dear Food.

MEAT IMPORTATION. A conference of the municipalities of Berlin and other towns resolved to petition the Federal Council to facilitate the importation of frozen meat in view of the decrease of food.

Mediterranean Situation.

ITALY SEEMS GUARANTEED. In connection with the polemics proceeding in the Franco-German Press on the Mediterranean the "Frankfurter Zeitung" makes the interesting revelation that Italy, leaving the Mediterranean being transferred into an Anglo-French sea, has guaranteed the Triple Alliance in 1912 that her interests in the Mediterranean are guaranteed. It is believed that the proposal is being favourably considered in Berlin.

Canadian Reciprocity.

RX-PREMIER'S ADDRESS. London, Sept. 19. Sir Wilfrid Laurier speaking at a Liberal demonstration at Sturgeon Falls, Ontario, affirmed his address to reciprocity. He said it was indispensable to Canada.

WORLD'S NEWS. BY CABLE. Usher Governed. NO SUBORDINATE. (Rush's Special to "E. A. Standard," London, Sept. 23. Conference with Russian Minister. Amplification of Entente. PRESS SUGGESTIONS ON PERSIA. London, Sept. 21. M. Sazonoff will confer with Sir Edward Grey at the Foreign Office to-day and will probably journey with him to Balmuccia, where they will hold a series of conversations to which the papers attach great importance as they anticipate an amplification of the entente chiefly in the matter affecting Persia.

Canada's Navy. PREMIER'S ANNOUNCEMENT. Montreal, September 23. Premier Laurier, in a speech, announced that the Canadian Parliament which has been summoned for November will deal with the Naval Question. Complete information touching on this subject is expected from the Imperial Government. Before the end of the next week the Government will have drawn up a final policy and submit it to the Parliament. Mr. Laurier said that the Government intend to handle the question in a non-partisan spirit.

South Africa's Garrison. Bathurst, O.F.C., September 23. The distribution of the permanent force in South Africa is announced. There will be five divisions made in the force, all of which will be stationed in the native territories or on their borders. There will be four batteries of artillery. If the Defence Minister had not been so well advised, the force would be crumpled in their dealings with South Africa.

London, September 24. (Reuters' Special to "E. A. Standard.") At Mr. F. E. Smith was the chief speaker at the meeting of the Committee at the British Club in London yesterday evening when Baron Bisserstein was elected as ambassador to Germany. The meeting at the British Club was attended by a large number of public men, and it was held in the afternoon.

It was unanimously resolved that an address of welcome in lines drafted by the Chairman should be presented to the new Governor.

ELECTRIC CURRENT

There was a lecture during a discussion on the Electric Lighting of the town. Mr. Mayer raised a discussion as to the advisability of the Chamber petitioning the Governor to take up the matter on behalf of consumers, as the Electric Current supply conditions were not satisfactory. At this point Mr. Baydon as director of the Nairobi Electric Lighting Co. deemed it advisable to vacate the Chair which was then taken by the vice-chairman, Mr. Beaton.

Mr. Mayer in the course of some trenchant remarks alluded to what numerous consumers were being put, and that various reforms in the working system of the Company might be effected—such as the appointment of experienced inspectors at regular stations to make frequent examinations of the system, etc. He said that he and his partner had called on Mr. Baydon and had informed him that his firm would be satisfied if the Company would give compensation for the losses incurred during current failure. Mr. Baydon would not listen to compensation, but he had informed him that (by the speaker) was going to the Attorney-General to seek redress.

Mr. Baydon retorted that Mr. Mayer had come to his office and what he had said amounted to "£1000 per year" as he will say no more about it.

Mr. Mayer replied that it was only Mr. Baydon's way of putting it. All he asked for was the same treatment as the Company gave to the Municipality.

Mr. McNeill said he was satisfied. His firm was not charged for the time when current was not on.

Mr. Mayer asked Mr. Baydon why his firm was not treated in the same way. Mr. McNeill replied that he was on the same footing as the Municipality.

Difficulties in procuring materials, storms, etc., often intervened, and the task of the Company was no easy one. He thought the Company was greatly indebted to the Company.

Mr. Mayer said he considered many of the accidents to the system were preventable.

The matter closed by Mr. Mayer holding that a letter should be written to the Electric Company which Mr. Playfair supported and it was decided to forward a copy of the same to the Company recommending that steps be taken to improve the existing conditions of their public lighting and power service.

Acting Governor at Mombasa. NETS DEPARTMENT FROM CHAMBER OF COMMERCE. IMPROVED COASTAL STEAM SERVICES PROMPTED.

His Excellency the Acting Governor paid a visit to Mombasa on the 26th inst. of the week, and at his request was met by a deputation of the committee of the Mombasa Chamber of Commerce at 10 o'clock on Monday, Sept. 23, in one of the Provincial Commissioner's Offices.

The first business on the agenda was the question of improved Coastal Communication, which had been the subject of special resolutions, unanimously passed at the annual general meeting of the Mombasa Chamber of Commerce, held on August 30.

The Acting Governor informed the deputation that the Italian line intended to start a new coastal service with suitable steamers about the beginning of the coming year. Also the Union Castle directors appear to have something in view, although as yet they had not written any definite letter.

Referring to the bad condition of the road from Mombasa to Malindi it was stated to the deputation that owing to the distance of the present path from whence the road was obtained it would be very expensive to construct a proper macadamized road.

Although the official agenda sent to the committee of the Chamber of Commerce contained no reference to the small-pox outbreak on the Island, His Excellency was informed that the President of the Chamber was satisfied with the measures that had been taken by the Government.

In reply the deputation intimated, we understood with some diffidence as being outside its warrant, that the Chamber of Commerce was well satisfied with the measures adopted by the Medical Department as regards public vaccination.

The Acting Governor said it was the intention of the Government to build a quarantine camp at English Point.

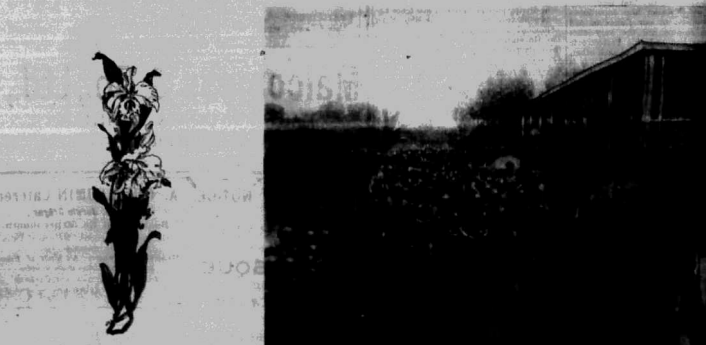

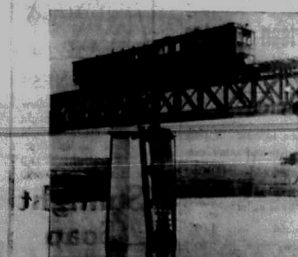

WORLD'S NEWS.

Germany's National Loss.

(Dunbar's Special to "E. A. Standard," London, Sept. 25.)

Public demonstrations have been held in Berlin and throughout Germany in honour of the late Baron. Marshall von Bieberstein and grief at his death. WORLD'S NEWS. BY CABLE.

Typhoon in Japan. HEAVY LOSS OF LIFE.

Reuter's Special to "E. A. Standard." London, September 26. A report from Reuter's agent at Tokyo, Japan, which has just come through states that the capital has been isolated since the 22nd instant on account of a typhoon. Wide spread devastation is reported throughout the vicinity. Details are meagre but indicate the worst. The typhoon is raging on the middle and the south coast.

The news that comes to hand states that the French Cruiser the Dupret dragged her anchors and stranded in Yokohama harbour. This was however got off on the 26th. A Japanese mail boat has foundered off Shimozuki but the number of casualties is unknown. The Japanese warships Satsuma and Manchu have been dismantled and four destroyers and two torpedo boats have been driven ashore. Heavy loss of life is reported at Nagoya where there are a railway, a munitions and arsenals which have all collapsed.

On Sunday night a tropical cyclone with strong and all on hand were lost; two others were also damaged. The typhoon is the worst that has been experienced for half a century. The damage exceeds forty million yen (over £1,000,000). The death toll is vast and exceeds one million. The typhoon was most severe at Nagoya, Osaka, Gifu and Naniwa. Ten thousand people are homeless and there is not a single house undamaged. At Nagoya a tidal wave demolished the harbour wharves; three steamers while several have been driven ashore. The casualties at this place are estimated at 200 killed and 200 injured. The Gifu and the Kikumaru have foundered and the Fushin with all her cargo and passengers has been lost. At Osaka twenty thousand homes have been demolished and the harbour wrecked, while the socialist shrine of Nara, reputed to be a thousand years old, collapsed in a house of cinders.

London, September 27. A message from Tokyo dated the 26th states reports that communication has not yet been restored. Further news from the scene of the disaster states that 400 fishermen have been drowned at Nagoya. There is no news of the three missing torpedo-boats. In many places throughout the course of the typhoon temples, theatres, schools and offices have all been wiped out. Whole forests have disappeared as though struck by a giant hand. The face of the country is unrecognisable.

German Meat Famine.

STEPS TO BE TAKEN FOR RELIEF.

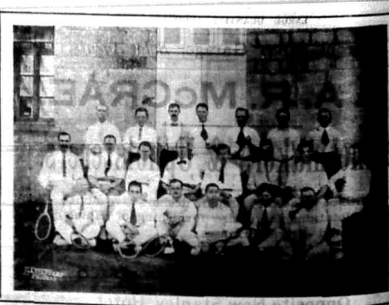

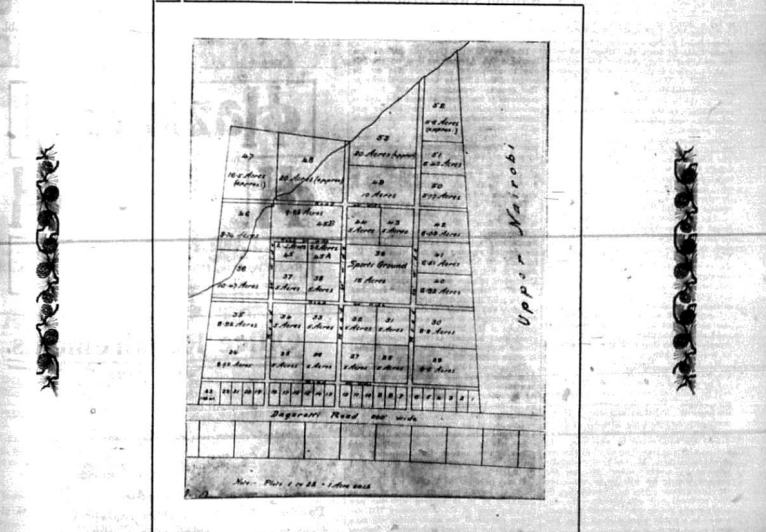
