gauge service which are avoided in the half plate inserted between the aluminium crankcase and the pressed steel bottom pan prevent surging and foaming and clean the oil before it approaches the pump. Normal oil capacity of the pan is 8 qts (7 1/2 lbs).

The engine mounted the two cylinder blocks with the top tank in the middle. This unit is a compact 2 1/2 gal. 187 horse is fitted with a new radiator arrangement which is attached to the front of the engine. The radiator is located at the right side of the engine, the radiator outlet is at the left side and a rubber hose connection is used in facilities service work and simplify maintenance. Temperature control is obtained by the characteristic shutters at the front of the radiator. A thermostat actuated by the heat at the top tank operates these shutters. This device has been modified into a triple action.

A multiple disc clutch connects the engine and gear box. The driver and five driving discs are carbon steel with the latter face on both sides with asbestos friction material of 7/8 in. (100 x 50 mm) diameter. Driving discs engage the fly-wheel through the medium of gear teeth while the pressure discs connect with six rectangular splines on the forced shaft hub. The gears is conventional in every respect, one center control of three speeds and reverse.

Gears are ground and standard as last operating noise is reduced to the minimum. In both engine and gear box design an extensive study has been devoted to the most important characteristics. The rear end of the upper shaft assembly carries the speedometer drive gear and back of that unit a universal joint which is located in the spherical housing in which the front end of the shaft is centered.

An overrunning clutch and positive automatic control the starting motor which is placed alongside the motor and mounted in the back of the clutch housing. The upper half of the ball bearing is cast integrally with the combustion while another aluminium casting completes the lower enclosure.

An Heiss 100 amp. hr. storage battery is mounted in a pressed steel bracket under the right side of the driver's seat while the space at the left forms the tool box. The performance of the National team Country champions, H. H. Harrower (Hullshire), in winning his relay race in the new record time of 4 hours 41 minutes 17 seconds, cannot be related too highly. In securing the first prize challenge cup they beat last year's winners and the three ex-champions, Hinchfield Harrower (Hullshire), by a considerable margin after a hard-fought struggle, which lasted practically the whole way, and at the finish were well ahead of the previous best time of 4 hrs. 45 mins. 24 1/2 sec. made by the Middlesbrough club last year.

Hinchfield were second in 4 hrs. 46 mins. 46 secs., and South London Harrower, the Southern champions, third in 4 hrs. 52 mins. 40 sec., after a stern tussle with Herve H. Harrower, who finished fourth. Hurring Athletic Club, winners of the metropolitan relay race 1924, were fifth, and Cambridge Harrower sixth.

A HIGH FIELD.
Twenty teams started and all Hinchfield staff were being carried by ten men, and the changes were made in quick succession. Middlesbrough, Hullshire, Harrower, Hinchfield and Plymouth, the five fastest runners, were despatched from Palace Yard as Big Ben boomed out the hour of eleven, and the finish was at Brighton Aquarium, a distance of 55 miles, 1,429 yards.

Over the first stage, a fine struggle took place between C. E. Bennett, the Hinchfield captain and National ex-champion, and the young Halloway Harrower and International champion, Patten, and the two Hinchfield practically together in second time for the journey. Hinchfield were ahead at the end of the second relay, but the third Hinchfield runner had established an advantage of 200 yards at Plymouth, and from the start the Yorkshiremen kept in touch.

At Plymouth their advantage was only 25 yards, but in the next two stages they drew right away and their final runner, Ernest Harrower, the National champion, and former International champion, ran out on the last stage from Plymouth to Brighton, with a lead of 51 minutes. He was met and pressed and won as he liked, running through mud, rain and darkness, though his competitor had had to struggle all the start through heavy rain and hail and along wet roads.

ROAD WALKING.
The remainder of Saturday's programme consisted mainly of road walking events, and this activity was to be noted in view of the importance of the 20 Miles National Championship. Both Eastern Walking Club and Devon Harrower decided their club championships and in each case the holder retired. Over the 100 miles Cornish Walkers' Open, the winner G. B. Godwin, the X.A.A. seven miles champion, won the "Herring" Cup and Silver W.C. championship in 2 hrs. 45 mins. 27 1/2 sec., the holder H.W. Mason, retiring 21 miles from home with cramp, after walking seven

in that point. J. F. W. Mason, who was second to finish in 2 hrs. 47 1/2 sec., the holder, retired with an allowance of 35 minutes.

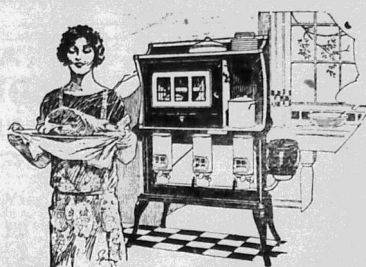
The Halloway Harrower's triumph over at Plymouth attracted attention, and the five who had won the "Herring" Cup for three years in succession, E. G. Cooper was first home in 2 hrs. 36 min. 31 sec., and with an allowance of 17 minutes 30 sec. won the walking handicap.

The seven ten mile championships, which were held at Woodstock Park, proved an interesting occasion. The team honours were captured by those of the exempting club finishing within four points. Great Eastern Railway, the holders, retained the title, with 13 points, for three runners. Southern Railway, A. Harrower, A.A. third with 17 points. Southern Railway, however, supplied the individual winner in E. Harrower, who posted an easy victory at the expense of the holder, G. Parker (O.V. Eastern Railway), the former's time being 10 minutes 27 1/2 sec.

An interesting walking match was also held at Woodstock Park, one concerning the Leeds Office and a team representing C. F. Heath and Co. The race being between the Metropolitan Police and the Cambridgehire Walking Club. In the former match, the contest was very close. Seven champions in 1925 and laureate champions in 1926 respectively, and the result, seeing eight miles, was a comfortable win for the Leeds Office, 61 points against 75 points. The winners had the first two men home in A. H. H. Pope, who covered the seven miles in 58 mins. 28 sec. and C. R. Woodyard, who lost out in three yards. R. C. Mayes, of Heath and Co. was third, over the three yards. R. C. Mayes.

The other match was a return encounter and resulted in an easy win for the Metropolitan Police, who scored 28 points, for a man against the 20 points of the visitors. The Cambridgehire men, however, showed excellent form, particularly B. Lewis, who finished third behind those two, well known walkers, T. C. Batson and P. Nichol. The former covered the 7 miles course in 61 minutes, 30 seconds, and beat Nichol by half a minute.

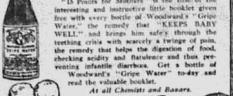

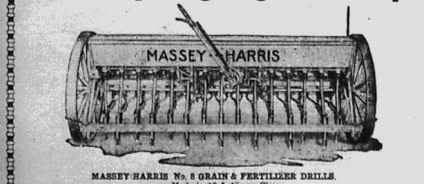
