The Submarine Disaster. Fifteen Drowned. MANOEUVRES STOPPED. London, Oct. 5. The Admiralty has issued the names of Lieutenant Frank O'Brien and fourteen men that were drowned in the B submarine accident reported in our earlier columns. His Majesty the King sent a message of sympathy to the relatives of those who lost their lives. The other submarines that were taking part in the manoeuvres have been ordered to return to their home ports. The manoeuvres have been stopped.

WORLD'S NEWS. BY GABLE. On the Vorge of War. Enthusiasm at Stamboul. ALLEGED INVASION OF TURKEY. (Heuser's Special to "E. A. Standard.") Emperor Francis Joseph who is credited with the summing up of the situation in the Balkans says that he confidently hopes that no war will be possible. Diplomats have sometimes worked under the impression that a telegram from Constantinople received at Paris last week that a detachment of Bulgarians have invaded Turkey to the north of Kozhata. Against this telegram comes an official denial from the Turkish Government that any attack was made on frontier posts. The destroyers in the Mediterranean fleet are proceeding towards Greece.

MASS MEETINGS AND DEMONSTRATIONS. A most enthusiastic meeting has been held in Constantinople, the people interrupting the speaker by waving the Balkan States' demonstration held in the vicinity of the Palace passed a vote of assurance to the Sultan that they were ready to go with his army. His Majesty replied that he was proud of such subjects. Volunteers are coming in by the thousands.

The Powers "Steam-Roller." London, Oct. 7. The difficulty of the "European steam-roller" policy is being pointed out by an inspired statement issued in Paris yesterday evening, which, though couched in reassuring terms, admits that the Powers and Great Britain are in view of possible intervention in the Balkans, which that they have no intention of being drawn into a Balkan war. The Powers are, however, in view of the progress of Balkan mobilization and extension are regarded as serious symptoms. Meanwhile the reports from Turkish sources of the gradual mobilization of the Turkish troops continue but are denied at Rome. The semi-official "Tribune" declares that Italy in view of the continued Turkish tergiversations has fixed an exact date for Turkey's annexation or refusal of the Italian conditions. The dispatches from Ouchy of the peace negotiators, particularly for Italy and India for Turkey, is believed, however, to indicate that peace is imminent. The Porte has withdrawn its troops from Bosnia where the reports proclaimed a Republic.

Certainty of War. PORTS OBSTINATE. WILL ONLY SUBMIT TO ARMED INTERVENTION. PEACE WITH ITALY. London, October 7. That war is certain appears to be indicated by dispatches from Constantinople declaring that the Porte is resolved to submit to nothing but to the armed intervention of the Powers. It is to meet no proposals for reform nor reduce its forces until the delivery of the Balkan States mobilization.

Nicaraguan Revolt. BANGUINARY BATTLE. U.S.A. ENTERS THE FIELD. A great battle has taken place at Nicaragua, the Government forces having killed and two hundred wounded in an action against the rebels. Many of the United States marines, who had gone by request of the American Consul, assisted the Government forces. Four Americans were wounded. The Government subsequently announced that it had announced that the rebel leader, who had been captured and shot dead later. The battle is believed to have been the last of the kind which has taken place in Central America for years. It is explained that the United States Government has taken steps to protect for itself the foreign interests.

AMERICAN RAILWAY DISASTERS. LOSS OF LIFE. New York, Oct. 6. An express train from Boston to New York was derailed on the embankment and caught fire, when eight people perished. A goods train hauled on a gradient, and derailed at a station at Atlantic City, and overturned into a crowded waiting room. Nine people were killed and one hundred and twenty two were injured.

WORLD'S NEWS. BY GABLE. Balkans Situation. (Heuser's Special to "E. A. Standard.") Premier Sazonov's close co-operation with Premier Poincaré and the possibility of Paris has made Paris the centre of speculation. From what proposals emanate and to which replies it is expected that the Powers will make rather a point of her suggestion regarding the representation which should be made by Austria and Russia to the Balkan States. Vienna, Oct. 7. The Press prophesies that the Government will accept the proposal which, however, is somewhat vague. The French Premier declares that Austria-Hungary to whom the maintenance of the status quo and the preservation of peace are equally important will welcome any action that is likely to secure speedy success. London, Oct. 7. Hosts at Paris have said that Austria has accepted the proposal regarding slight modifications which Sazonov and Poincaré have accepted. The proposals will then be submitted to the other Powers. 72,000,000 FRANCS FOR BULGARIAN ARMY. Sofia, Oct. 7. The Bulgarian Government has submitted to the Parliament a bill providing for an extraordinary army of 200,000 men, 2 million francs and also another bill which has been accepted. The proposals will then be submitted to the other Powers. Applying Villayat Law. REFORMS PROVIDED. Constantinople, Oct. 7. The local agency of Heuser learns from official sources that the Porte has resolved to apply the Villayat Law introduced in 1909 by the Ottoman delegation in its agreement with the international Ottoman Committee. The reform provided in article 28 of the Treaty of Berlin. The Law which has been approved by the Powers has slumbered in departmental pigeon holes and has never been applied. The Committee held at Kozhata upon the measure of the 5th of August has concluded the Villayat Law, which, according to penal services and several other minor sections.

ROSENTHAL MURDER CASE. ANOTHER WITNESS MURDERED. (Heuser's Special to "E. A. Standard.") New York, Oct. 7. Another sensational development has occurred with regard to the Rosenthal murder case. On the eve of the 19th of October, the Director of Police who is implicated with the murder and various gambling businesses, a notorious gambler named going by the name of Big Jack Lewis, who is alleged to have supplied the Rosenthal murderer, turned State evidence and was shot in a frame-up by a fellow gambler named Davidson. Davidson's trial had been begun. He alleged that he had been in the city long but had not the trial of the police. Davidson was murdered to prevent his giving evidence.

SOCIALISM IN AUSTRALIA. The Attorney General has announced that the Government is seeking to regulate home rules and the disposal of food and commodities. BRUSH WITH THE NICARAGUAN INSURGENTS. The American marines had another fight with the Nicaraguan insurgents and thirteen rebels were killed. Several of the marines were slightly injured. PARIS-BORDEAUX TRADE AGREEMENT. 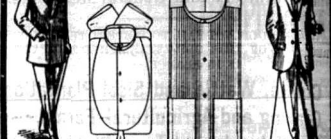

The So-Called Diving or Dowsing-Rod.

The singular success of certain "dowsers" in locating underground water hard by wells has led to the formation of the Society of Psychical Research to study the phenomenon. F.R.S., to investigate the matter on this subject some twenty years ago.

Like most people Professor Barrett was at that time not only sceptical but inclined to scoff at what was then regarded as the work of an ignorant superstition. Scientific investigation has shown that dowsing is not a matter of clairvoyance and the twisting of the dowsing rod is of stage-play.

It has been shown that the dowsers who were successful in their work were amateurs, and that their success was due to the fact that they were able to restrain the free of the forked twig in the ground.

It was not until the end of the eighteenth century that the rod was used in England for finding underground water and was first used in the South-West of England.

Two centuries earlier it was employed for this purpose in the South of France. Quincey tells us of the wonderful success of the "jovers," as he calls them, in some cases in certain parts of the ground water is very hard to locate, and whose surface is nearly level.

At the present day, landowners and well-sinkers in the South-West of England when in difficulty where to sink a well, almost invariably employ a dowsing rod, usually an unpolished man who has discovered that he possesses this peculiar "gift" as he terms it.

The use of the dowsing rod has also spread to America, where it is employed not only in the search for underground water, but also for finding oil-springs.

During the latter half of the nineteenth century in England, among other notable dowsers, John Mullins of Wilshire, was a notable success in locating underground water, especially when all other means had failed.

In some districts, of course, underground water can be found anywhere upon digging down a few feet, or even when the ground is covered with an impermeable bed of clay, but there are places where the dowsing rod is nearly always successful.

It is in what may be called "faucure water," which is the geologist's difficulty, that the dowsing rod is most successful. It is assumed to consist of a mixture of water and gas, which is held in solution by the pressure of the atmosphere.

The late Sir Henry Harrison had built a mansion, water towers, etc., on the fine estate near Horsham in Sussex. He died had a well, 90 feet deep, sunk, hoping to get water from it.

cost of £1,000, but the result was a complete failure. Finally in despair, he consulted one of the dowsers, John Mullins. Sir Henry met him at the station, drove him to the place and gave him no information. Mullins perceived that the water was holding his forked twig and, after searching for some time in vain, the dowsing rod turned violently and he asserted an abundant supply of water would be obtained at that spot at a depth of under 20 feet. Another spot was found close by, and both were on a small elevation. Two years later were dug at these spots through a sandy loam containing the thinnest perennial supply of excellent water was found at a depth of 10 feet deep. It is true shallow wells are generally objectionable, but these two were to be an excellent potable water, as it comes from a hill-top.

The sandstone being over the Horsham clay was unanticipated being covered with surface soil and grass. The explanation of the dowsers' success might possibly have been attributed to a sharp eye for the ground, but it is not for the fact that the dowsers were no geologists, was a stranger to the locality, and the spot had been passed over by the scientific experts previously engaged.

The next case is still more remarkable and here J. Mullins was also concerned. In 1887 the proprietors of an extensive bacon factory, at Waterford, Messrs. Richardson and Co., needed a larger supply of water than the town supply could supply. They had a well 62 feet deep sunk at the spot, but no water was found.

The dowsing rod was used, and based on geological considerations, determined to have a borings made at that spot. This was carried out and a bore hole 292 feet deep was sunk, and, as only a trifling quantity of water was obtained, the bore-hole was abandoned.

The next year, however, other borings were made, and one of these had a bore hole, 72 inches diameter, sunk at the bottom of the 292 feet well. The work was undertaken by the Diamond Drill Boring Company. With difficulty, a hole 72 inches was bored through a very hard Silurian rock, but no water was obtained.

The boring was, however, continued 388 feet deeper, or a total of 350 feet which—added to the depth of the well—made 1912 feet in all from the surface. The result was a complete failure, and the bore hole which cost nearly £11,000, was abandoned. Then acting upon the best geological advice, another spot was selected and a bore hole 72 feet deep was made.

The strata encountered were, however, identically the same and geologists advised the firm to go no farther, as the quest was hopeless. They were considering the advisability of moving their factory elsewhere from Wilshire. He came over, and he told nothing of what had been done, he walked over the premises, about 700 by 800 feet in area, asked questions, but treated the ground silently, holding his forked twig.

Suddenly at one spot, only a few yards from the deep bore-hole, the forked twig dived so violently that it broke in his hands. Here Mullins declared there was an abundant supply of water which he estimated would be found 90 to 100 feet below the surface.

WORLD'S NEWS. BY CABLE.

In the Commons. Question of Breach of Oath.

RETENTION OF GREEK VESSELS.

(Reuter's Special to "E. A. Standard.")

London, Oct. 19. When the House of Commons assembled to-day Mr. J. King (L. Somerset, N.) asked whether the speeches of certain Privy Counsellors and also the Government had been referred to the Law Officers of the Crown in order to report if a breach of the oath of allegiance had been made.

Mr. Asquith replied that he was aware of the speeches. The matter was being considered. (Liberal cheers.)

Sir Edward Grey announced that the British Ambassador at Constantinople had been instructed to point out that the retention of Greek vessels was not justified by international law and as far as British interests were affected he must strictly observe all rights.

The House was crowded when Mr. Asquith introduced the gaulois resolution on Home Rule and the subject of the Government, which was not only to pass the bill in the present Parliament (cheers and counter cheers), but to pass it with provisions so carefully criticised and revised that it would become a real, live, workable measure. The time available was ample and generous. The Opposition's object was to destroy not to amend the bill. Without the gaulois motion the bill would consume time in passing it, and it was time it should become law.

Mr. Bonar Law in moving the amendment that the bill requires the free and unfettered consideration of the House and that the House declined to restrict discussion, that the Government was impelled to pass the measure which they knew would never be approved by the people. The speaker then proceeded to dwell on Ulster. He said that he recognized fully his responsibility concerning the matter. They were told that this was adopted lawlessness but there must be a limit somewhere. People residing in the times of James the Second and Robert's retained constitutional authorities. Mr. Bonar Law continued that the Government knew that the sense of injustice the Ulsterites were feeling was such that outbreaks were possible, which would mean massacres. They had only been restrained by the wise leadership of Sir Edward Carson—prolonged Liberal laughter—and the belief that there must be an appeal to the people. He affirmed that Ulster would soon be like a powder magazine. He asked had the Government no responsibility? If they meant, without an election, to carry Home Rule at the point of the bayonet, Heaven help them. If they did not, as he believed was the case, they were a body of miscreants incurring terrible responsibility. If bloodshed came the blood-guiltiness would be theirs (Opposition cheers).

In answer to question from Mr. Hewitt, Sir Edward Grey replied that after the passage of the Panama Canal Bill in the United States that if eventually there was a difference between the two countries respecting the interpretation of the Hay-Pauncefote Treaty which could not be settled otherwise we would ask for arbitration on the whole subject including the views of the legal advisers of the Crown who now had the matter under consideration.

HOME RULE DEBATE.

Instead of violence as anticipated during the debate on Mr. Asquith's resolution it has been manifested by laughter, cheers and a cross fire of personalities. Sir Edward Carson explained that though he had signed the bill he and his friends would not lose their tempers as they preferred to remain in full force rather than be expelled from the House.

Submarine Funeral Service.

London, Oct. 19. An impressive funeral was held over the main submarine B 2 in the afternoon in the presence of a number of warships of the fleet to which B 2 belonged. There were hundreds of people who came to witness the sight on the cliffs of Dover but a pall-like mass enveloped the funeral fleet.

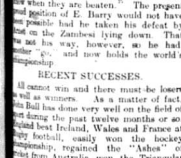
